INTRODUCTION

Unveiling Tragedy: In Numbers

There are moments in history that remind us of the destructive nature of human conduct. While some resuscitate our trust in humanity, often it reflects the tragedy and farce of our kind. The devastating episode in Manipur has shaken our conscience to the core. In light of such infliction, this pamphlet is executed to highlight a verifying fact about the action of a community that falsely implicates another community by instigating violence in a disparaging and horrendous manner. The content in this pamphlet, which has been in the making for over three months, though startling, provides information of losses on various fronts— death, economy and demographic relocation of population solely based on identity.

It is important to note that in instances of conflicts, the resulting casualties extend beyond human suffering enveloping economic wreckage. The first section in this pamphlet quantifies the economic losses inflicted as a result of the ethnic conflict, encompassing devastated infrastructures, personal and business assets, as well as the minor components that sustain livelihoods. The figures provided herein serve as stark reminders about the losses that have occurred and the ensuing efforts that must be undertaken to recover and revitalize our society.

As the reader delves into these pages, the second section reveals a staggering account of lives lost during the present ethnic conflict. Each name represented should not be reduced to mere numbers and statistics, but rather seen as a unique story with a tragic ending, severed by the enduring violence. Amidst this poignant image lies the details of abandoned habitations left to deteriorate into smouldering ruins with no viable alternatives. The testament of the chaos that ensued as violence gripped Manipur is evident from the details provided above in addition to the disheartening facts about burnt economic essentials. The unremorseful act of ravaging churches, which are symbolic of faith that transcends ethnic identity, crumbled on the faces of indoctrinated communal entities hell-bent on eradicating any traces of the 'other'. The assault signifies a majoritarian mindset designed to dissociate themselves from the minority Kuki-Zo ethnic group bounded by shared faith, culture and history.

The third section of this report discusses a major consequence of the ongoing ethnic conflict: the displacement of individuals who now face the daunting task of rebuilding their lives after the traumatic events they have endured. Delhi recorded a massive influx of internally displaced persons (IDP), whose account the Kuki Welfare Delhi recorded. While the number of IDPs seeking refuge in Delhi escaping persecution is likely in the thousands, collecting comprehensive data on them at present is infeasible.

The process of rehabilitation and reconstruction is a complex undertaking that requires careful consideration of the many challenges and obstacles that lie ahead. It is imperative that concerned authorities must establish adequate planning to expedite the grievances meticulously in a prompt and efficient manner to minimize any disruption to their daily lives.

To fully comprehend the gravity of this ethnic conflict and accurately distinguish between the victims and aggressors, an extensive enumeration of the Sequence of Events is presented in the fourth section. The chronological account of the present conflict is to examine the escalating tension which has deepened and persisted as the situation raged on. This timeline serves as a cogent reminder that understanding the past is imperative to prevent such atrocities from recurring in the future.

Overall, this pamphlet narrates a story of the heartbreak and destruction of a community whose only fault lies in the fact that they belonged to a particular ethnic group. Therefore, it is intentional when invoking memories of the dearly departed souls on whose absence our shoulder of unity widens for years to come.

MEASURING THE ECONOMIC COST SUFFERED BY KUKI-ZO TRIBES DUE TO CURRENT VIOLENCE IN MANIPUR

1. Introduction

As history has repeatedly shown, conflicts impose immeasurable human suffering and large economic and social costs. The loss of human life, destruction of infrastructure, human capital, and institutions. Political instability and greater uncertainty associated with conflicts can impede investment and economic growth- not only during conflict but also afterward, making it difficult to escape the “conflict trap.” The recent ongoing ethnic cleansing of Kuki-Zo tribes in Manipur has led to huge economic loss for the Kuki-Zo tribes which can lead them into vicious cycles of poverty trap and economic backwardness. The term Kuki-Zo is used in this paper to denote all the Kuki, Zomi, Hmar, Chin and Mizo tribes who basically share the same culture, common ancestry, language, land and history. These minority tribes suffered brutally at the hands of majority Meetei community tacitly supported by the Manipur government in the ongoing violence in Manipur.

There is huge economic disparity between the hill districts and valley districts in Manipur. All economic progress and infrastructure development happen in Imphal valley alone. The tribals in the hills rely on agriculture as their main source of livelihood with lower average income. The recently released Multidimensional Poverty Index 2021 by NITI Aayog where the Hill districts - Churachandpur, Chandel, Senapati, Tamenglong & Ukhrul has higher headcount ratios (HCR) - proportion of multidimensionally poor in double digits (range of 14.74 - 18.50 %) vis-a-vis the valley districts which is in single digit (range of 2.12 - 7.46 %) - Imphal East, Imphal West, Thoubal & Bishnupur of Manipur. The hill districts have on average more than twice the number of poor people living in valley districts. In fact, Churachandpur with a HCR of 15.35 %, Senapati with a HCR of 15.60% and Tamenglong with a HCR of 18.50 % are almost 3 percentage points above the national average of 14.96 %.

The ongoing ethnic violence in Manipur has not only resulted in suffering and loss of human lives but also brought huge economic loss in terms of destruction of livelihoods, damage to infrastructure, decline in working population, inflation, shortages, uncertainty, rise in debt and destruction to normal economic activity. Given the existing lop-sided nature of development

between the hill and valley districts of Manipur, the Kuki-Zo tribes of the hill districts have been disproportionately affected by the violence and severely rendered homeless, jobless and deprived of basic necessities necessary for survival. The current violence will further push the hill tribals particularly Kuki-Zo tribes into extreme economic deprivation and poverty. The objective of this study is to estimate the economic losses suffered by the Kuki-Zo tribes in monetary terms during the ongoing ethnic violence in Manipur. The study will estimate the value of houses, schools, churches, vehicles destroyed from 3rd May, 2023 till the second week of July, 2023.

2. Data Collection and Methodology

To study the economic losses incurred by the Kuki-Zo tribes in Manipur, the Kuki Students' Organisation Delhi & NCR formed "Economic Loss and Survey Team" in the month of May 2023. The team comprises of students and scholars in the field of economics and other related fields. The team members interviewed different people affected by the violence to gauge the extent of destruction suffered by Kuki-Zo tribes. The study employed interview method- personal interview and telephonic interview to collect data from the affected villages or colonies. We used both qualitative and quantitative techniques to study the economic losses suffered by the Kuki-Zo communities.

The qualitative aspects of the study help us in understanding the nature and intensity of violence, the mental traumas suffered by affected persons, displacement, conditions in relief camps and so on. These however could not be quantified in monetary terms. The quantitative aspects of the study help us to measure the monetary value of properties destroyed, the number of houses and villages burned down. The Chief of the villages or members of village authority are interviewed to understand the extent of losses and are asked to give self-estimated value of properties destroyed in the violence. In case where the village chief couldn't estimate the value of property loss, the Survey team gave approximate value to the cost of properties. In total, 196 villages/ colonies were included in the study. The study covers a time period from 3rd May, 2023 till the second week of July, 2023. It did not include properties of villages destroyed or burned after second week of July, 2023.

3. Findings from the study

The study estimates the number of villages and houses burned down belonging to minority Kuki-Zo villages. It also estimates the number of churches, schools and vehicles destroyed in the ongoing violence in Manipur.

3.1 Number of villages and houses burned down

A total of 196 villages belonging to Kuki-Zo tribals have been burned down by the majority Meetei community since the conflict erupted in 3rd May, 2023. The total number of houses burned down is 7342. The number of villages and houses burned down in all affected districts are given table 1. Kangpokpi district saw the maximum number of villages and houses burned down. A total of 103 villages and 3803 houses are burned down in Kangpokpi district alone. Almost the entire Kuki-Zo settlement in Island Block in Kangpokpi district was burned down.

In Chandel district, 41 villages comprising of 1442 houses are burned down. A village named 'Aihang' which housed Pu Letpao Haokip, Tribal Affairs Cabinet Minister was among the first village to be attacked and burned down in Chandel district. The entire Kuki-Zo villages in Sugnu town was burned down. There are 25 villages and 594 houses being burned down in Churachandpur district. Kangvai Village and Torbung villages in Churachandpur district were the first Kuki- Zo villages burned down by Meetei community on 3rd May 2023. It was after the burning of these villages that the riots spread to different parts of Manipur.

On the first day of violence, the Kuki-Zo settlements in Imphal were simultaneously attacked by Meetei radical groups such as Arambai Tengol and Meetei Leepun. New Lambulane, Paite Veng, Mantipukhri, Langgol and Game villages were attacked on the night of 3rd May 2023 itself. Even, the presence of heavy security forces in the capital city did not deter the majoritarian mob and Meetei militants from burning down Kuki-Zo localities. A total of 13 Kuki-Zo settlements in Imphal West along with 974 houses were burned down. In Imphal East, a total of 10 colonies belonging to Kuki-Zo tribals along with 445 houses were burned down. A Kuki-Zo locality named Haokip Veng, which was gifted by the Meetei King Bodhachandra to Haokip Chief of Chassad in 1949 as a symbol of friendship was attacked and burned down. In fact, Haokip Veng was one of the worst affected areas even though it was located adjacent to the chief Minister's residence with heavy security presence.

The houses of Kuki-Zo ministers, MLAs, top ranking bureaucrats are not spared either. The house of Pu Letpao Haokip, Tribal Affairs cabinet Minister was the first one to be burned down on 3rd May, 2023. Pu Vunzagin Vale, MLA and Adviser to Chief Minister was physically attacked and left to die. Even the official quarter of the only woman cabinet minister Pi Nemcha Kipgen was not spared and reduced to ashes. The houses of top Kuki-Zo police officers including DGP of Manipur police were attacked and burned down. The house of Pu Clay Khongsai, IPS, ADGP Manipur was burned down along with the entire colony named Khongsai Veng. Big and leading enterprises belonging to Kuki-Zo communities are not spared either. Vishal Mega Mart, Touchworth Industry, and Misao Gas Agency were torched and reduced to ashes. The story continues.

The Kuki-Zo tribals in Imphal took shelter in military camps. Many of the people fleeing for their lives to these camps were waylaid and killed on the way. Pi Gouzavung, Under-Secretary, Government of Manipur along with his son Sasang were among those killed on their way to military camp. Letminthang Haokip, an Income tax officer was killed inside his official quarter. Two girls named Florence and Olivia were gang-raped and brutally killed. These are just a few names. Today, many dead bodies are still lying in Imphal hospitals. In Tengnoupal district, 4 villages along with 84 houses which are burned down by the Meetei militants in the ongoing violence in Manipur. Tengnoupal district has seen the least violence and attack by the majority Meetei militants. This is because Kuki-Zo villages are located in the interiors of the hills and are far away from the periphery area of Imphal Valley.

3.2 Destruction of Churches and Schools

Churches are sacred place of worship for Christian. The Meetei mobs and militants did not spare churches even though they are well aware that place of worship should be respected for all religions. The Imphal valley being the capital of Manipur has lots of prominent churches for Kuki-Zo communities. The Kuki Baptist Convention and the Kuki Christian Churches has their headquarters located at Imphal, both of which are burned to ashes on the first week of violence in May 2023. Similarly, Churches belonging to various denominations of the Kuki- Zo communities such as EBCC, ECA, UPC, TPC, Mizo Presbyterian Church, CBA, ZCBC, Chongthu Baptist Church etc were burned and destroyed. Many catholic churches including St. Paul Church at Koirengei Imphal were burned. A few Naga Churches in Imphal area were torched as well.

A total of 211 churches belonging to the Kuki-Zo community are destroyed. Kangpokpi district has witnessed the largest numbers of churches destroyed followed by Chandel, Churachandpur, Imphal West, Imphal East, and Tengnoupal respectively. The number of churches and schools belonging to Kuki-Zo tribals that are destroyed in the current violence in Manipur are given in Table 2.

Schools are educational institutions that are centres of knowledge and learning. In a poor state like Manipur, they played an important role in shaping the lives of thousands of students. Unfortunately, even schools are not spared and are burned down to ashes. A total of 92 schools belonging to Kuki-Zo tribals are destroyed.

This includes prestigious schools owned by the catholic church such as St. Joseph's School located at Sugnu, Chandel district. These schools did not cater to the education of only Kuki-Zo tribal community. They provide education to children of all communities. In an interview with NDTV, one school headmistress who works in a school located in Kangpokpi district near the foothills of Imphal said that she called up her Meetei friends and plead to them not to burn the schools and its hostels. She thought she could reason and convince her Meetei friends and family as the school has students from surrounding Meetei villages for the last 30 years. She and her students numbering about 90 had to flee to jungles and hid for 3 days and 3 nights before they were rescued by the Indian Army. They watched their school and hostels burn down from a distance where they were hiding for their safety. Kangpokpi district has witnessed the largest number of schools burned down at 46. It is followed by Chandel (28), Churachandpur (9), Imphal West (5), Imphal East (2) and Tengnoupal (2).

3.3 Number of Vehicles destroyed

There are a number of movable and immovable properties destroyed in the violence. While it is not possible to count and measure each and every property destroyed, we managed to collect the number of vehicles destroyed during the survey. Properties such as gold, diamonds, jewellery, refrigerators, air conditioners, sofas, beds, kitchen items, etc could not be collected in our study. We count the number of two-wheelers, four-wheelers, and other vehicles such as autorickshaws, tractors, harvesting machines, and JCB Bulldozers. The detailed number of vehicles destroyed according to district wise are given in Table 3.

A total of 1327 two-wheelers are destroyed out of which 582 are from Kangpokpi alone. Another 283 two-wheelers from Imphal East, 267 from Chandel, 96 from Churachandpur, 83 from Imphal West, and 16 from Tengnoupal are destroyed in the mayhem. The number of four-wheelers destroyed stands at 701. Kangpokpi district has seen the maximum destruction of four-wheelers followed by Imphal West and Imphal East. The vehicles of Kuki-Zo communities were sieged by the Meetei mobs and militants on their way to the military camp in Imphal area. These vehicles were set on fire and the photos and videos are widely circulated in social media posts. The most disturbing pictures emerge from Langol to Lamphel road and resembles war zones from Libya and Syria. Another 174 vehicles belonging to other categories were destroyed. Vehicles belonging to other category includes three-wheelers like auto-rickshaws, bicycles, JCB bulldozers, trucks, harvesting machines, tractors, etc.

3.4 Total monetary value of properties destroyed

The Kuki-Zo tribals suffered tremendously in the ongoing ethnic violence perpetrated against them by the Majority Meetei community. All the Kuki-Zo colonies in the state capital are burned to ashes. The entire Kuki-Zo population in Imphal Valley have been driven away to the hills of Manipur. We estimated the value of properties destroyed on the basis of telephonic conversation with either the chief of villages or members of village authority which give us the approximate value of properties destroyed in their locality or villages. The total value of properties destroyed belonging to Kuki-Zo tribals is estimated to be Rs. 15,599.01 crores. These do not include the values of land which the Kuki-Zo tribals may not be able to regain in the future. Including the land values particularly in the Imphal valley will exponentially increase the number of losses suffered by the Kuki-Zo community.

The total monetary value of property destroyed belonging to the Kuki-Zomi-Hmar community is given in Table 4. Kangpokpi district has suffered the greatest loss amounting to Rs. 6900.007 crores, followed by Chandel (Rs. 2743.3 crores), Imphal West (Rs. 2546.13 crores), Imphal East (Rs. 2073.01), Churachandpur (Rs. 1179.9 crores) and Tengnoupal (Rs. 156.66 crores).

4. Effect of conflict on the economic conditions of Kuki-Zo tribes

The ongoing ethnic violence has further deteriorated the economic deprivation and misery of the Kuki-Zo community living in these hill districts. This cost the livelihood of Kuki-Zo people as majority of the Kuki-Zo people derived their livelihood from agriculture and livestock rearing activities. The recent conflict had led them to abandon their villages where they lost their land for cultivation. The destruction of physical capital like machinery (rice mills, tractors, trucks, etc.) is an important factor of production for their agriculture activities. Some families rear animals throughout the year which they use it for their children's education at the end of the year. As many as 85,122 livestock were destroyed during this violence belonging to the Kuki-Zo community. In addition, the vandalization of shops and other business activities rendered the self-employed with no avenue for income.

The savings and investments of the Kuki-Zo people are in tangible assets like land, house, cattle animals, etc. Most of them did not invest and save in financial markets due to lack of financial literacy. It took one generation and their lifetime savings for Kuki-Zo people to build a simple house, or church, and buy vehicles and other properties which in turn are used for investment. All these assets and properties become bequests to their children as well. The destruction of houses, churches, and their other properties costs more to them as it will take another generation to rebuild. Some Kuki-Zo families invest in informal financial instruments such as 'Marup' where lenders and borrowers are from different communities. Many of them suffered huge monetary losses as their financial investments and instruments are stuck in Imphal and within the Meetei community. The cost of human capital suffered by Kuki-Zo tribes is huge and significant. The destruction of schools (both private and government), government dispensary hospitals, Anganwadi Centre, public water tanks, wells, and pumps constructed under the Jal Jeevan mission not only incur a high cost of physical capital but also lead to a great loss of human capital to Kuki-Zo tribes.

All of the relief camps where Kuki-Zo resides are funded by their own civil society organisations and churches. There is no funding either from the state or central government so far in running relief centres in Kuki-Zo hill districts of Manipur. Various donations from Mizoram, Nagaland and different parts of India and abroad keep these relief camps running. The unhygienic condition of Relief camps where more than 40,000 displaced people stayed without basic amenities led to an increase in malnutrition, infant mortality rate, and maternal mortality. The mental trauma due to the violence and destruction of their lifetime hard earnings of the Kuki-Zo tribes is something that can have a long-term impact. The ongoing conflict has compelled teachers and students to take up guns to defend their lives and villages. The closure of education institutions in the affected area of hill districts will severely affect the learning outcomes of students and incurred a huge loss of human capital for the society in the long run.

5. Limitations of the study

The study is very important to understand the extent of loss suffered by the minority Kuki-Zo tribals in the hands of the majority Meetei community. The study relies on obtaining data and estimates of property values from the village chief or village authority. It could not contact and obtain information from affected persons individually. The study team could not visit the sites where villages or houses are burned. So, the estimates of the values of property destroyed during the violence in Manipur rely mostly on the self-reported values of village chiefs or village authorities. Thus, the actual and self-reported values of the property could differ widely or marginally. The most important cost such as mental trauma, loss of lives and means of livelihood, human capital due to the absence of schooling for students could not be measured but will naturally impact the economy of the Kuki-Zo tribes.

6. Conclusions

The loss and destruction of houses, villages, livelihood, savings, investments, human capital, and other properties of Kuki-Zo tribes will lead them to extreme poverty, economic deprivation, malnutrition, diseases, etc. The Kuki-Zo tribes will be trapped in an endless vicious cycle of poverty trap. The unequal distribution of social infrastructure and unequal budget allocations by the state government between hills and valleys for the past decades along with the current conflict will further aggravate the economic conditions of Kuki-Zo

tribes. Till the second week of July, the ongoing ethnic cleansing of Kuki-Zo tribes has claimed at least 112 lives, 196 villages burnt down, 7,000+ houses burnt, 200 plus churches and quarters burnt, and displaced 41,425 people.

The losses suffered by the minority tribal population in Manipur should be adequately compensated by the government. The announcement of the Manipur government to give a compensation of Rs. 10 lakhs for those who died in the violence is too little and insignificant compared to the loss suffered by innocent people. The central government should intervene immediately to rebuild the lives of affected persons. The study undertaken by us put the monetary value of the loss of properties suffered by Kuki-Zo tribes at Rs. 15,599.01 crores. The calculated accumulated asset loss of Kuki-Zo tribes is almost 43% of Manipur's GDP for the year 2021-22. This does not include the value of lands owned by Kuki-Zo tribes in the Imphal area and other affected districts of Manipur. The Central Union should sanction a separate amount of not less than Rs 20,000 crores to rebuild the economy of Kuki-Zo tribals and adequately compensate all the affected victims of the ethnic violence. While economic support will give certain amount of justice and relief to the Kuki-Zo communities, political solution in the form of separate administration for Kuki-Zo inhabited areas of Manipur will bring permanent peace to Manipur. Denying the tribals their political and economic demands will lead to perpetual cycles of violence and humanitarian crises in the border state.

CHRONOLOGICAL ORDER OF EVENTS IN THE MANIPUR ETHNIC POGROM, 2023

WEDNESDAY, MAY 3, 2023

(I) Lamka, District- Churachandpur District, Police Station- Churachandpur Police Station.

1. At around 10:30 a.m, in Lamka Public ground, Kuki-Zo tribals from across the district came together in large numbers for the peace rally organized by the All Tribal Student Union Manipur (ATSUM) against the Meiteis demand for Scheduled Tribe Status. The rally ended at around 1-1:30 p.m and the crowd had dispersed and returned to their respective homes and localities.
2. At around 2:00 p.m, Meitei miscreants burned the pillar of the Anglo-Kuki War Centenary Gate in Leisang Vaiphei village destroying some stone inscriptions which were prevented by few locals. A Meitei man wearing the ISTV press vest was spotted around the area in a suspicious manner.

(II) Kangvai area, District- Churachandpur, Police Station- Churachandpur Police Station

1. At around 2:30 p.m, Kuki-Zo residents of Kangvai area who had gone to participate in the rally found their homes vandalized and properties destroyed by Meitei locals in their absence. The venue for the rally i.e District Headquarter was about 15 km away from Kangvai.
2. Rally goers returning home, were stopped by Meitei men in hundreds claiming to be from the Meitei Leepun. It was learned later that the radicalized Meitei youths called "Arambai Tenggol" were responsible and already present in Kangvai. They had come from other places like Moirang and Tronglaobi to intentionally cause havoc.
3. At around 3:00 p.m, Churachandpur Police was alerted of the situation.
4. At 4:00 p.m, Kangvai violence escalated. Youths from both communities were reportedly pelting stones at each other.
5. At around 5-5:30 p.m, Kuki-Zo CSOs in order to control the situation by any means tried to calm down the mobs from the Kuki-Zo side, however, the efforts went futile when Meitei mobs began burning Kuki-Zo homes in Kangvai which led to the situation escalating beyond control.
6. At 8:40 pm, curfew order under Section 144 of COCP 1973 was announced by the DC office of Kangvai, Tuibong and Churachandpur sub-divisions (Viz No.4/28/2020-DC/CCP). Internet suspension for 5 days was announced by the Commissioner office (Viz No.H-3607/4/2022-HD-HD).

Imphal Area:

(I) New Lambulane- Checkon area

First attempt to attack New Lambulane was at around 6:30-7 p.m. Meitei mobs started grouping up near Citizen Club in New Checkon searching and targeting Kuki-Zo tribals residing in the said area in Imphal. Second attempt to attack the locality was around 9-10 p.m on the same day two (2) two-wheeler, an Eco van and a car were set ablaze by the Meitei mobs. One Kuki-Zo man Mr.Thangjalam Touthang a resident of 3rd Street New Lambulane was dragged out of his home and brutally beaten. KBC Centre Church was also attacked for the first time at around 8 p.m.

(II) National Games Village

At around 7-7:30 p.m, Kuki-Zo localities were attacked and KCC church was burnt along with several other homes and quarters occupied by Kuki-Zo Tribals.

(III) Langol Area

Phaipijang Langol area was attacked for the first time at around 8 p.m. Meitei attackers burnt the Langol Christian Church in Quarter area and the attack came from Hebron Veng in Phaipijang at around 10-11:00 p.m. Around 10 houses were burnt down and a Kuki-Zo man Mr. James Lamminlal Khongsai was pulled out from his home in Hebron Veng and bludgeoned to death by the Meiteis. Four cars, one auto, one bike and one scooter were also burnt down.

(IV) Khongsai Veng

At around 6:30 p.m Meitei mobs in large numbers with knives and sophisticated weapons broke into Khongsai Veng in LaiphamKhunou, near Khuman Lampak Stadium, Imphal. There was an exchange of fire between the local volunteers and the Meitei radicals youths believed to be from Arambai Tenggol, Meitei Leepun and Kangleipak Kanba Lup. Later, four Meitei youths were sent into the locality to spy on the area who were apprehended and interrogated by the village authority and Khongsai Veng Youth Club. Later, they were released and handed over to the Meitei community in the presence of the local leader, Mr. Olen (Meitei Actor) as a gesture of goodwill. The Meitei attackers retreated to regroup and strategized to plan further attacks using google maps indicating loopholes to infiltrate into the locality from all sides which went viral on social media.

(V) Manipur University, Canchipur

Following the violence in Kangvai, Meitei men in hundreds reportedly gathered in front of MU in a manhunt for Kuki-Zo tribal students at around 8-8:30 p.m. Later, at around 10:10 p.m, Meitei mobs invaded Manipur University (MU) hostels of both Ladies as well as men's hostel and staff quarters. The Kuki-Zo students were asked to produce ID cards to verify and filter along with faculty members who had to flee to the Assam Rifles Camp at Langthabal. The belongings were specifically targeted and destroyed.

10:30 p.m: Gun houses in MG Avenue and State armories including several Police stations and training centers across Imphal were looted by Meitei mobs. Thousands and lakhs of ammunition were reportedly looted.

THURSDAY, 4 MAY, 2023

(I) Manipur Bhawan, New Delhi

KSO Delhi along with all sister organizations staged a protest in front of Manipur Bhawan, Delhi against the ethnic pogrom of the Kuki-Zo tribal minorities demanding imposition of President's Rule.

(II) Churachandpur

At 6:00 am in the morning Meitei Civilians from Chiengkonpang and New Lamka area were safely escorted from the hill areas to Imphal by Assam Rifles. Womenfolk from the Kuki-Zo communities formed a human chain for the Meitei civilians to safeguard them from any untoward harm from mobs.

At around 6:30 p.m, Article 355 was imposed on Manipur and at around 7:00 p.m shoot at sight order was released by the Commissioner (Home) [viaNo.H-3608/2/2023-HD-HD].

(III) Imphal

At 10:00 a.m, efforts were made to evacuate the Kuki-Zo civilians from Imphal. However, roads to hill districts were blocked by the Meitei protestors, and the Kuki-Zo people were sent back to their respective army shelter camps in Imphal. In the afternoon, at around 3:30 pm the first Paramilitary Forces arrived in Imphal Airport.

1. Pangei, Imphal East

At 1:45 p.m, Manipur Police Training Centre at Pangei in Imphal East was stormed by Meitei mobs to loot the State Armory. One hundred and fifty-seven INSAS rifles, fifty-four SLRs, thirty-four 9mm carbines, twenty-two INSAS LMGs, 9mm pistols, several magazines, AK-47s, three hundred and thirty-three rifles among others were stolen by the Meiteis.

2. Irilbung Police Station, Imphal East.

Sophisticated arms, bulletproof jackets, seal guard helmets and fibre sticks were reported stolen by Meitei mobs, spearheaded by the Meitei womenfolk at around 5:00 p.m.

3. Keikul Outpost

Meitei mobs looted five INSAS rifle, ten SLR Rifle, five 303 Rifle, eight INSAS magazine, twenty-two SLR magazine, one hundred and five live rounds of INSAS Rifle, five hundred and eighty live rounds of SLR Rifle and five 303 rifle magazines from the Keikul Police outpost under Heingang Police Station and torched down public property.

(IV) Aizawl, Mizoram

1. At around 11:00 a.m, Mizoram Chief Minister, Shri.Zoramthanga requested the CM of Manipur to handle the urging situation addressed in his letter (Viz D.O No.CMO.37/2021/237).
2. At around 6:00 p.m, Mizoram CM, Shri K.Vanlalvena writes to Amit Shah, Minister of Home Affairs of India to take immediate action in Manipur to control the dire situation targeted towards the Kuki-Zo brethren (Viz Do. No.MP(RS)/MIZ/005/006/2023),
3. YMA Mizoram announced support for the Kuki-Zo brethren in Manipur, especially those that had been displaced and urged the Mizo people to accommodate them in any way possible (Viz No. CYMA74/2022-2023/9 of 4.5.2023)

Imphal

1. At around 9:30 p.m, Pu Vungzagin Valte (Thanlon MLA) was attacked to be butchered by Meitei Mobs on his way back after a high profile meeting with the CM Biren Singh. His driver Mr. Thanghoulal Zou was brutally lynched by the Meitei mobs.
2. At around 9:40 p.m, Shri.Ashutosh Sinha, IPS,ADGP (Intelligence) was appointed as Operational Commander, to be supervised by Kuldeep Singh, Retired IPS by Commissioner (Home).
3. At around 11:30 p.m, a Meitei Mob raided a Police station and seized all arms and ammunitions.

IMPHAL AREA

(I) Deulahlane, Imphal

Kuki-Zo institutions and churches were targeted and burnt in broad daylight. Kuki Christian Church Hospital and Trulock Bible Seminary and several other Kuki-Zo houses were charred by the Meitei mob in Deulahlane and Vishal Shopping mart and Bazar India located in Khongnang Ani Karak in Chingmeirong area of Imphal was also looted by them.

(II) Khongsai Veng

At around 1:00 p.m, Armed Meitei radicalized youths numbering in thousands came to attack Khongsai Veng for the second time. The local youths and volunteers used stones and catapults to defend themselves. Failing to break through the main gate, the Meiteis brought in heavy vehicles to storm open the shielded locality gate. In the process many were injured and Mr. Thangginlun Lumpheng was shot dead in the process. Unable to defend the colony against thousands of well-prepared radicalized Meitei youths who came with sophisticated weapons, the Kuki-Zo residents specially the elderly, women and children fled to Nagaram by climbing up fences and between buildings as they had no other option. Two men namely Mr. Ngamthang Lungdim and Mr. Jamkholal Lungdim while fleeing from the area were caught and lynched by the Meitei mob in front of their family members. The Meiteis looted every household item including tiles and Church roofing, windows and even bathroom & toilet tiles were not spared. Vandalized houses were later burnt down.

(III) Haokip Veng

At around 1:00 p.m, Arambai Tenggol in cohorts with the Manipur Police forces attacked Haokip Veng from two directions i.e from Mahabali Kabui Khul and Palace compound. The Meitei radicalized armed youths came in thousands and started burning Kuki-Zo houses from Mahabali onwards. The Kuki-Zo residents had taken refuge in Kingdom Kids school and later had to flee to 1st MR from Sanjenthong area. The Meiteis looted every household and later burnt the houses down. Properties and vehicles worth in terms of crores were lost.

(IV) Mantripukhri Area

Residents of Vaiphei Veng and Vengnom had to flee to IGAR south while leaving their homes behind that were looted and burnt by Meitei radicalized youths.

(V) Konung Mamang Area

Two Kuki-Zo women namely, 1. Florence Hangsing and 2. Olivia Chongloi were raped and brutally murdered after they were picked out from a group of employees where they used to work. They were employed at Gama Car Wash in Imphal.

(I) Sangaiprou, District- Imphal West, Police Station- Lamphel Police Station.

At around 3:00 p.m, an Income Tax Assistant, Songthat Letminthang Haokip posted in Imphal was dragged out of his official quarter room (Type 1, A/2, , Block 1, 2nd floor, CPWD Quarter, Sangaiprou) brutally beaten and burnt alive by Meitei mob. He was a resident of B.Ebenezer village, Tuibuong in Churachandpur district.

(II) Lhunjang Village, District- Churachandpur district, Sub- Division- Samulamlan Block, Police Station- Kumbi Police Station

At around 2-3:00 p.m , Meitei militants disguised as Manipur police forces attacked Lhunjang a Kuki village in Samulamlan block of Churachandpur district where a Kuki-Zo man, Chonkholen Haokip a CRPF constable of the delta company of the 204thCoBRA Unit who was on leave was shot and killed. Lhunjang is located 6 km east from the district headquarter.

(III) B. Phainom Village, Kangpokpi District

The first attack took place on 3rd May and with the help of the Village Volunteers they managed to push them back, but they were unable to hold their defense the next day (May 4th) when they were attacked again by the Meitei mob which also consisted of Commando Personnel from the Manipur Police.

At around 3:30 – 4:00 p.m, while the villagers were running for their lives, two Kuki-Zo women were caught by the Meitei mob and were paraded naked and sexually assaulted openly. The women were forcibly taken down a road, naked, to a paddy field in broad daylight while being surrounded by scores of men who groped and allegedly gang-raped one of the women. One Kuki-Zo man who was trying to protect the two ladies was killed immediately by the mob. When another man (the brother of the woman) tried to stop the assault, he was also murdered.

(IV) Salam Patong Village, Sadar Hills East, Kangpokpi District

At around 6:30 p.m, the village was under the attack by the Meitei mob, in which half of homes of the Kuki-Zo community were burnt down. At the end of the day, a total of 37 inhabited areas of the Kuki-Zo community which lies under various districts (Chandel, Churachandpur, Kangpokpi and Imphal) were attacked and burnt down by the majority Meitei community.

FRIDAY, 05 MAY, 2023

(I) Imphal, Manipur

The Indian Army convoy evacuating Kuki- Zo tribals from Imphal to Kangpokpi district were ambushed at Sekmai

(II) Churachandpur

13 Kuki-Zo men were shot/bludgeoned to death by the armed Meitei community. At the end of the day, 12 Kuki-Zo villages under Kangpokpi District were attacked and burnt down

SATURDAY, 06 MAY, 2023

(I) New Lamka,Churachandpur District

1.Ms.Nianghoihching of Sim Veng and Mrs. Kimmalsawm of Vaal Veng, Ngathaland and Mr. Joseph Liansianmuan were shot dead by the Central Security Forces in New Lamka.

(II) RIMS, Imphal

Mr.Thanghoulal Zou, driver of Thanlon MLA Shri Vungjagin Valte who had been brutally mob lynched by Meiteis earlier on 4thof May succumbed to his injuries on 6th May 2023. At the end of the day, 10 Kuki-Zo villages under Kangpokpi District were attacked and burnt down.

SUNDAY, 07 MAY, 2023**(I) 1st MR, Imphal**

At around 10:00 a.m, stranded Kuki-Zo people who were taking shelter in 1st MR were escorted to the Airport. Earlier on 5-6th May depending on the tickets they could get, Kuki-Zo tribals were escorted to the airport by the Central forces.

(II) Salam Patong Village, Sadar Hills East, Kangpokpi District

At around 3:30 p.m, the village was attacked again and all the remaining houses were burnt down.

MONDAY, 08 MAY, 2023**(I) 2nd MR, Imphal, Manipur**

Stranded Kuki- Zo tribals from Chandel and Tengnoupal districts who had taken shelter in 2nd MR Ragailong, Imphal were escorted by the central forces to Pallel at around 3:30 p.m.

(II) Supreme Court, New Delhi

During a hearing on May 8, the Supreme Court heard two petitions related to the violence. One was filed by a BJP MLA challenging the High Court order, while the other was filed by the Manipur Tribals Forum, Delhi calling for an inquiry by a Special Investigation Team. The bench, led by Chief Justice Chandrachud, directed the Centre and the Manipur Govt. to provide relief camps for those who are displaced, ensuring they have access to basic amenities, food, and medication. Chief Justice Chandrachud orally said that a High Court does not have the power to direct changes in the Scheduled Tribes List.

TUESDAY, 09 MAY, 2023**1. Imphal, Manipur.**

Kuki-Zo tribals from Tengnoupal and Chandel districts were evacuated from different Army camps across Imphal to which they had fled for safety when they became targeted for their ethnicities

2. Bongbalkholen, Saikul, Kangpokpi – Island Block

Even after the village was burnt down on 5th May, at around 11:00 a.m, the Meitei mob numbering to more than 300 which consisted of commandos from the Manipur Police attacked the village again.

THURSDAY, 11 MAY, 2023**Churachandpur District**

At around 7:00 a.m, Kuki-Zo villages in the periphery between Churachandpur and Bishnupur districts such as Molngat, Molphei Tampak, B. Khonom area came under heavy attack by a joint force of Manipur Police commando and Meitei terrorists. The Meitei attackers came with bulletproof vehicles using automatic and sophisticated weapons to attack the said Kuki-Zo inhabited areas.

FRIDAY, 12 MAY, 2023

(I) Guwahati, Assam

Shri. Letpao Haokip, MLA Tengnoupal AC, Shri Paolienlal, MLA Saikot AC and Shri. Haokholet Kipgen, MLA Saitu AC on behalf of the ten Kuki-Zo MLAs representing the Chin-Kuki-Mizo-Zomi hill tribals released a press statement demanding Separate Administration saying that the unabated violence that began on 3rd May perpetrated by the majority meiteis tacitly supported by the existing government of Manipur has totally partitioned the state on ethnic lines.

(II) North Campus, Delhi University, New Delhi.

Concerned students of Delhi University came together at Delhi School of Economics (DSE) to protest against the ethnic pogrom of Kuki-Zo tribal minorities and to show solidarity with the tribal victims of Manipur.

SUNDAY, 14 MAY, 2023

Imphal, Manipur

Mr. K Athouba, Media Coordinator of the Meitei CSO, COCOMI said that the organization has been active only four days since the violence started and that their intervention is only to mediate and diffuse the tension. He also stated that COCOMI has been working to pressure the state as well as Central Government to resettle the displaced populace to their respective localities.

MONDAY, 15 MAY, 2023

1. The ten Kuki-Zo MLAs wrote to the Home Minister asking for administrative separation from the Meitei centric and anti-Kuki Government of Manipur.
2. N. Biren Singh rejected the demand for separate administration saying there is no threat to the integrity of Manipur

THURSDAY, 17 MAY, 2023

(I) CRPF Camp Lamphel, District- Imphal West, Police Station- Lamphel Police Station.

The evacuation of Kuki- Zo tribal residents of National Games Village and Langol area who had taken shelter in the CRPF camp since 3-4th of May was completed on 17th May, 2023. The evacuation to different hill districts had begun on 6-7th of May.

(II) Bongbal Kholen, District-Kangpokpi District, Sub-division- Saikul, Police Station- Maphou Dam Police Station

The Indian Army patrol team recovered Explosives & Remote Initiation Mechanism for IEDs including 3 kg TNT, 15 Electric Detonators and 4 Circuits & Remote Firing Device . The village had been earlier attacked and burnt by Meitei militants on 4th of May 2023. All the villagers had fled to other Kuki-Zo dominated areas, leaving their charred homes behind that were ransacked, vandalized and overpowered by Meitei attackers.

(III) Supreme Court, New Delhi

The Judges and Lawyers discussed the situation of Manipur again. The Solicitor General emphasized the importance of peace and tranquility and mentioned that there have not been any fresh incidents of violence. The Chief Justice (CJI) asked about the rehabilitation measures taken for the victims and requested to see the report. The hearing concluded with a mention of victims seeking compensation and the government representative acknowledging the issue of illegal immigrants from Myanmar. Overall, the hearing discussed the need for peace, the status of rehabilitation measures, the extension of time granted by the High Court, and concerns related to the judgments, attacks, and illegal immigration. The court stressed its role in ensuring law and order while being mindful of the political aspect and the limitations of its jurisdiction.

FRIDAY, 18 MAY, 2023

Friday, 18 May, 2023

Meiteis continued looting Khongsai Veng, a Kuki-Zo locality in Laipham Khunou near Khuman Lampak Stadium in Imphal. In a video circulated online, Meitei women and girls were seen stealing iron rods, construction sands, cement, and bricks.

SATURDAY, 20 MAY, 2023

Jawaharlal Nehru University (JNU), New Delhi.

Concerned students came together at Sabarmati Dhaba, JNU Campus to protest against the Ethnic cleansing of Kuki-Zo tribals by the majority Meitei community in Manipur. The protest was organised in solidarity with the Tribal student victims of Manipur University, Jawaharlal Nehru Institute of Medical Sciences (JNIMS) and Regional Institute of Medical Sciences (RIMS) and Delhi University.

SUNDAY, 21 MAY, 2023

Kangchup Area, Kangpokpi District.

At around 6:00 p.m, Meitei militants attacked Kuki-Zo villages in Kangchup area under Kangpokpi District.

MONDAY, 22 MAY, 2023

New Lambulane area, Imphal, Police Station- Porompat Police Station.

At around 4:10 pm, Meitei mobs set ablaze abandoned houses of the Kuki-Zo tribals in New Lambulane, Imphal

WEDNESDAY, 24 MAY, 2023

(I) Phousanphai Village, Churachandpur district.

At around 5:00 a.m, Meitei attackers burnt down several houses in Phousanphai and neighbouring Kuki-Zo villages. The area is located near Kwakta in Bishnupur District

(II) Aizawl, Mizoram.

On the request of Mizo Zirlai Pawl (MZP), Shri Lalsangliana, Director of School Education, Mizoram issued a notice to allow admission to all displaced students from conflict torn Manipur even without proper documentation.

FRIDAY, 26 MAY, 2023**(I) Kangvai, Churachandpur**

Heavy firing was reported from Kangvai and Torbung Area at around 12:30 a.m.

(II) Songdo/ Phuoljang

Heavy firing was reported to be coming from Phuoisangphai area from where the Meiteis were

SATURDAY, 27 MAY, 2023**(I) Serou, District- Kakching, Police Station- Serou Lamkhai Police Outpost.**

A Kuki-Zo youth, Mr. Albert Thangminlun Haokip of Phaisi village in Chandel district was shot dead by Meitei militants in Serou.

(II) Molphei Tampak, Churachandpur

Heavy firing was reported at around 7:00 p.m. The Meitei attackers were also using mortars against the Kuki-Zo defenders. Two volunteers were shot dead by the Meitei armed groups at Suangdo near Kangvai.

SUNDAY, 28 MAY, 2023**(I) Sugnu Area, District – Chandel, Sub-division- Chakpikarong Sub division, Police Station- Sugnu Police Station.**

In the midnight of 27th May, the Meitei police posted in Sugnu breached the Ching-tam Peace Pact by blank firing from Sugnu Police Station. The Peace Pact had held the small town together for 25 days since the violence escalated simultaneously across the state since 3rd May. H.Gamnom village located near Sugnu Awang Leikai was first burnt by the Meitei neighbors. Intermittent firing followed the burning down of Kuki-Zo homes in H. Gamnom village. The next morning at around 11:00 a.m, Meitei radicalized armed groups i.e the Arambai Tenggol, Meitei Leepun and local Meitei inhabitants spearheaded by the Manipur State commandos and police personnels in thousands attacked Langching, a Kuki-Zo Village nestled between two Meitei localities namely Wapokpi and Sugnu Bazar. Two villagers namely Mrs. Lethoi Haokip and Mr. Thangchon and a village volunteer Mr. Benjamin Guite were mercilessly butchered in the most barbaric manner. Mr. Thangchon was caught alive and mutilated. They were thrown into the burning homes where their bodies were charred beyond recognition. Several Kuki-Zo villages such as Zou Veng, Sugnu Lamhang, Khopimun (Sugnu Tribal), T.Munnomjang, B.Jangnom, Khengjoy Veng, B.Salemphai, Kholim, Uchatampak, Sharonphai, Boljang, Gothol were burnt the same day. In Zou Veng, Mrs.Chingzaluang, an elderly widow was burnt alongside her house. She could not be rescued as the Meitei attackers overpowered the local volunteers who had to flee for safety in the 37th Assam Rifles Camp. Meitei militants and mobs together burnt down the Sugnu Bridge, the only way that connects Sugnu to Lamka.

(II) Kangvai, Churachandpur

Firings were reported across different regions such as Kangvai in Churachandpur district, Kangchup area in Kangpokpi district and Leimakhong area that shares a border with Imphal west and Yaingangpokpi area bordering Imphal East. Simultaneous attacks on Kuki inhabited areas lying in the periphery between the hills and valleys by Meitei terrorists were reported.

(III) Imphal

In Imphal, Meitei mobs vandalized the residence of BJP MLA, KhRaghumani Singh at Uripok, Imphal West. At around 3:00 p.m, Meitei mobs looted the police armory at Khabeisoi, three hundred and twenty-two INSAS rifles of two versions, nine AF rifles, Assault rifles Excalibur and various other ammunition were looted

(IV) Likli, Wakonphai and Dolaithabi, Saikul – Kangpokpi District

Heavy firing towards Kuki-Zo inhabited areas of Saikul District were reported from 2-3:00 pm onwards. The Meiteis attacked Dolaithabi in huge numbers. Two village volunteers were killed in this firing. Nine Kuki-Zo people lost their lives on this day.

MONDAY, 29 MAY, 2023**(I) Jantar Mantar, New Delhi**

All Kuki-Zo Tribal women in Delhi organized a protest at Jantar Mantar demanding Central Government's fair intervention for Kuki-Zomi-Mizo-Hmar Tribals grievances against the ethnic cleansing in Manipur.

(II) Imphal, Manipur

Home Minister Shri. Amit Shah arrived in Imphal for a three day visit in the late evening. He is to visit different districts till 2nd June 2023.

(III) Babupara, Imphal

Meitei miscreants burned down KUKI INPI Complex at Babupara, Imphal.

WEDNESDAY, 31 MAY, 2023**(I) Chingdai Area (District - Kangpokpi)**

Several Kuki-Zo villages namely; Phailengkot, Chajang, C-Zoulen, Thingjang, Moljang and Lhanghoi were attacked and burnt down. One Kuki-Zo civilian was killed and burnt alive.

(II) Kakching Khunou, District- Kakching, Police Station- Waikhong Police Station.

A Kuki-Zo woman Mrs. Hatbem Kipgen was married to a Meitei man Mr. Kenedy. She was pulled out from the Relief Camp in Kakching Khunou where she had been taking shelter with her husband. She was raped, tortured and killed by the Meiteis.

(III) Jantar Mantar, New Delhi.

The Joint Unau Student's Forum Delhi, organized a Tribal Solidarity Protest against Ethnic cleansing in Manipur at Jantar Mantar, New Delhi.

FRIDAY, 02 JUNE, 2023**Kangchup Area (District - Kangpokpi, Police Station - Leimakhong/Lamsang, Sub-Division- Gamnom Sapormeina)**

Three Kuki-Zo villages namely; Nakhujang, Bethel and K.Songlung were attacked and burnt down by the Meitei armed groups. One villager was also shot dead by the Meitei Militants.

SUNDAY, 04 JUNE, 2023**Sugnu Area (District - Chandel, Sub-Division - Chakpikarong, Police Station - Sugnu)**

Seven Kuki-Zo villages namely; Lonpi Khonou, Sokom, Nazareth, Uchantampak, Boljang, Leisabung and Leilon/Leimakhong were attacked and houses were also burnt down by the Meitei attackers.

1. At around 1:50 p.m, a large number of suspected Meitei militants i.e., Arambai Tengol/Meitei Leepun with black dresses gathered at Khurukhul (Meitei colony). They were heading towards Leimakhong Kuki village to attack.
2. At around 2:00 p.m, Kuki-Zo villages namely, L. Munlui and Leilon Vaiphei were attacked with automatic rifles. The place is around 3 kilometers from Leimakhong.
3. At around 5:30 p.m, a minor Kuki-Zo civilian, Mr. Tonsing Hangsing (5 years), S/o Joshua Hangsing had been shot in the head by suspected Meitei militants. Tonsing was inside 22 AR, Kangchup camp when he was shot in the head. The miscreants shot Tonsing from outside the army camp. Tonsing was taken to RIMS Hospital, Imphal by the army for further treatment, however, on his way to the hospital, the Meitei mob who were more than hundreds in numbers, stopped the ambulance and burnt the child, his mother and a relative alive. His mother and the relative were both from the Meitei community.

MONDAY, 05 JUNE, 2023**(I) Motbung/Sekmai Area (District - Kangpokpi, Sub-Division – Gamnom Sapormeina, Police Station - Saikul/Sekmai)**

1. At around 1:00 a.m, Kuki villages namely, Luwangsangol and Phaileng were attacked by suspected Meitei militants using sophisticated automatic weapons. Meitei militants kept firing on.
2. At around 10:30 a.m, Meiteis militants intensified the attack with additional enforcement at Phaileng Kuki village with sophisticated automatic weapons. They indiscriminately fired upon villagers.
3. At around 5:00 p.m, Meiteis militants again attacked Phaileng and Luwangsangol Kuki-Zo villages simultaneously with sophisticated automatic weapons. The number of attackers increased and the weapons they used were more sophisticated than earlier.

(II) Kangchup Area (District - Kangpokpi, Sub-Division - Gamnom Sapormeina, Police Station - Leimakhong)

Meitei terrorists attacked K. Songlung (Kuki Villages) with sophisticated weapons. They burnt down 30+ houses. The Kuki-Zo village volunteers at Ponlen retaliated and a heavy exchange of firing occurred

(III) Leimakhong Area (District - Kangpokpi, Sub-Division - Gamnom Sapormeina, Police Station - Leimakhong)

At around 9:30 p.m, Meitei terrorists stationed in Kanto Sabal (Meitei village) started firing towards Leimakhong (Mission Veng and Vengnom) with sophisticated weapons. The Meitei terrorist kept firing indiscriminately for a long time. The Meitei terrorists marched towards Leimakhong with petrol bombs to burn down the village. However, the Army intervened and the Meitei terrorists retreated back to Kanto Sabal (Meitei village).

(IV) Sugnu/Chandel Area (District - Chandel, Sub-Division - Chakpikarong, Police Station- Sugnu)

Men in Manipur Police Commando dressed along with Meitei terrorists burnt down Kuki-Zo villages namely, Uchatampak, Boljang, Boipu Veng, Sahumphai, Gangpijang, Sokom, Leisanbung, Thingbongphai, Nazareth, Jangnoi, LonpiKhunou, Munpi, Hebron, K.Sabi, Utangpokpi, Kotsopai, Khopijang, Khumjang, Moltinchan, Singtom and few more Kuki-Zo villages. The Meitei terrorists used sophisticated weapons, mortal bombs, sniper rifles, automatic rifles and indiscriminately fired upon the Kuki-Zo civilian villagers. They completely burnt down the villages and several schools such as Grace English High school, Jonidas Kidsdom, Happy Childhood Montessori, Holy Child School and St. Josesh's Higher Secondary School were also burnt down. They looted properties and livestock before burning each home in the area.

TUESDAY, 06 JUNE, 2023

I) Sugnu/Chandel area (District - Chandel, Sub-Division - Chakpikarong, Police Station - Sugnu)

Four Kuki-Zo villages namely, 1. Y. Thingkanphai 2. L. Thinglhangphai, 3. Molbem and 4. Haipijang were attacked and burnt down by the Meitei armed groups. One Kuki-Zo volunteer was shot dead and many other civilians were injured.

Incident narrated by eyewitness Mr. Hemminlen Haokip resident of Y. Thingkanphai village:

Serou Practical High School: Assam Rifle, BSF, Manipur Police Commandos - are stationed. At around 5:00 a.m, one Casper vehicle originating from Serou Practical High School campus approached the area via V. Haipijang, a Kuki-Zo Village. On approaching V. Haipijang, men inside the Casper vehicle started indiscriminately firing upon the village volunteers. Terrified by the firing from the Casper vehicle, the village volunteers dispersed and ran for their lives. Among the fleeing volunteers two of them happened to run towards an open field (vacant paddy field). Gunshot from inside the Casper vehicle shot dead one of them in the open field, and injured the other. [This was at 5:43 a.m, as video recorded by the eye witness]. The Casper vehicle kept moving towards Y. Thingkanphai village and indiscriminately kept firing at the volunteers of Y. Thingkanphai. Mr. Hemminlen and his friends who are volunteers of the village fled the village and the Casper vehicle returned back and drove inside Serou Practical High School. Again, at around 10:30 a.m, three Casper came out from the Serou Practical High School. The Casper vehicles were followed by white colored gypsies of Manipur Police Commando. They entered the Kuki-Zo villages and burnt down four villages namely, V. Haipijang, Y. Thingkanphai, L. Thinglhangphai and Molbem.

THURSDAY, 08 JUNE, 2023**Langol area, District – Imphal West, Police Station - Lamphel**

Laimanai, Langol (Near Trevi Hospital) – 2 houses were burnt to ashes.

FRIDAY, 09 JUNE, 2023**Khoken Village (District - Kangpokpi, Sub-Division – Gamnom Sapormeina, Police Station - Leimakhong/Lamlai)**

Khoken (Kuki-Zo Village), death - 3 civilians, Mr. Jangpao Touthang, Mr. Khaimang Guite, Domkhohoi, and injured 2 civilians, Mr. Tongneh Haokip and Mr. Thanglhojang.

MONDAY, 12 JUNE, 2023**(I) Kangvai (Kuki Village), District – Churachandpur, Sub-Division- Kangvai, Police Station - Kangvai/Churachandpur**

Meitei militants attacked Kangvai. One village youth Mr. N Muansang was shot dead by Meitei terrorists from long-range. Some well-trained sniper men among the Meitei terrorists.

(II) Chingdai Area, District - Kangpokpi, Sub-Division - Saikul, Police Station - Saikul

1. Hundreds of Meitei terrorists attacked Khamenlok and nearby Kuki-Zo villages from a hilltop forest. Thousands of Arambai Tengol, Meitei Leepun and Manipur Police Commandos approached from the valley. When nearby Assam Rifles intervened, the Meitei terrorists fired upon them. The Central forces from Imphal who came to intervene were blocked by Meitei Meirapaibis.

2. Khopibung (Kuki-Zo village) was also attacked and all the houses were burnt down.

TUESDAY, 13 JUNE, 2023**(I) Kangvai/Tronglaobi Area, district - Churachandpur, Police Station - Kangvai/Churachandpur**

Thousands of Meitei militants gathered in Tronglaobi and Kangvai area. They opened fired at the Central Security Forces deployed in the border areas and the Central forces retaliated after a while.

(II) Bungpi Area, district - Kangpokpi, Sub-division - Saikul, Police Station - Saikul/Sagolmang

Five Kuki-Zo villages namely, 1. Khamenlok 2. Govajaang 3. Songjang 4. Thomboland 5. Joldanphai were attacked and burnt down by the Meitei militants.

WEDNESDAY, 14 JUNE, 2023**(I) Imphal, District - Imphal, Police Station - Lamphel**

At around 1:00 p.m, Meitei mob led by terrorists' group Arambai Tenggol and Meitei Leepun burnt down the official residence of Smt. Nemcha Kipgen, Minister for Textiles, Commerce & Industry and Co-operation Department, Government of Manipur.

(II) Island Block Area, District – Kangpokpi, Sub-Division – Saikul, Police Station – Yairipok.

Two Kuki-Zo villages, 1. Phailengjang and 2. Saizang were attacked and burnt down.

(III) Khamenlok Area, District - Kangpokpi, Sub-Division - Saikul, Police Station - Saikul

Two Kuki-Zo villages, 1. Aigejang and 2. Chullouphai were attacked and burnt down.

THURSDAY, 15 JUNE, 2023**(I) New Lambulane, District- Imphal East, Police Station – Porompat Police Station, Imphal.**

Meitei miscreants burnt down a few houses at 3rd Street, New Lambulane, New Checkon area belonging to the Kuki-Zo community in broad daylight. The Central Forces (RAF) who rushed at the spot to intervene but were blocked by the Meitei womenfolk. The fire brigade/services brought to the site to douse the burning fire were also blocked by the Meitei womenfolk, until the Meitei houses were about to catch the burning fire, only then the Fire Brigade was allowed to douse the fire.

(II) Kangvai Area, District- Churachandpur, Sub-division- Kangvai, Police Station- Kangvai.

At around 07:20 p.m, Meitei terrorists attacked Kangvai area with sophisticated weapons. One boy named Joel of Janglenphai Village was shot in the thigh by Meitei militants when he was standing in the verandah at his house, located close to the border area. Meitei terrorists simultaneously attacked the areas at four different locations. The firing continued till early morning of 16 June, 2023.

SATURDAY, 17 JUNE, 2023**(I) Langol, District- Imphal West, Police Station- Lamphel.**

Meitei miscreants burnt down Kuki-Zo houses in Langol, Imphal.

(II) New Lambulane, District- Imphal East, Police Station – Porompat.

One Kuki-Zo individual, Mr. Edward Haokip was accused of burning houses at 3rd Street, New Lambulane. He was arrested and later released from Police custody on the same as he was found to be innocent.

SUNDAY, 18 JUNE, 2023**Leimakhong, District- Kangpokpi, Sub-division- SaituGamphazol, Police Station- Leimakhong.**

Meitei terrorists from Kanto Sabal (Meitei Village) in large numbers with highly sophisticated weapons attacked Chingmang (Kuki-Zo Village). After they fired heavily with automatic guns, the village volunteers of Chingmang were not able to withstand the attack. The Central forces then intervened. However, two Indian Army Jawans/Soldiers were injured by the Meitei terrorists.

TUESDAY, 20 JUNE, 2023**Lilong, District- Thoubal, Police Station- Lilong Police Station.**

Four suspected cadres of UNLF were apprehended by the Indian Army in two separate vehicles with one 51mm Mortar and handed over to Police.

WEDNESDAY, 21 JUNE, 2023**(I) DIPR- Keisampat, District-Imphal West, Pincode-795004. Police Station- Imphal Police Station.**

At around 1:00 p.m, Mr. Akshay, a reporter for India Today News Channel was assaulted by Mr. Sanatomba Meitei inside the Directorate of Information & Public Relation (DIPR). Mr. Sanatomba had physically assaulted Mr. Akshay and also destroyed electronic gadgets. Mr. Sanatomba claimed to be a Karyakarta and that he carried out the attack/act under the supervision of Chief Minister N.Biren Singh.

(II) Urangpat Area, District- Kangpokpi, Sub-Division- Lhungtin, Saikul, Police Station- Saikul Police Station.

At around 7:00 p.m, combined group of suspected Meitei terrorists i.e UNLF/PLA etc attacked Urangpat, a Kuki-Zo village and the adjoining areas with sophisticated weapons. There was heavy gunfire from Meitei terrorists with little response from the civilian village volunteers of the village with licensed guns.

(III) Leimakhong Area, District- Kangpokpi, Sub-division- Gamnom Saparmeina, Police Station- Leimakhong Police Station.

1. At around 7:00 p.m, combined team of suspected Meitei Terrorist i.e. UNLF/PLA etc. attacked L.Tangnuam, a Kuki-Zo village with sophisticated weapons. The Indian Army intervened and there was an exchange of heavy gunfire.
2. At around 7:00 p.m, combined team of suspected Meitei terrorists i.e. UNLF/PLA etc, attacked L. Munlui, a Kuki-Zo village. There was an exchange of gunfire with the village volunteers.

(IV) Kangvai Area, District- Churachandpur, Sub-division-Kangvai, Police Station- Kangvai,Churachandpur.

1.At around 7:30 p.m, unidentified person/miscreants planted IED bombs in Kwakta-Phougakchao (Moirang) which is the border of Bishnupur district with Lamka (Churachandpur). Phougakchao is under Moirang police station. Three individuals were injured in the attack. The intention/motive is suspected to destroy the bridge connecting the Imphal-Teddim Road connecting Imphal and Lamka.

THURSDAY,22 JUNE, 2023**Khoken Area, District-Kangpokpi, Sub-division-Gamnom Saparmeina, Police Station- Leimakhong/Lamshang.**

Meitei terrorists attacked N.Boljang (Kuki-Zo Village) in New Keithelmanbi area with sophisticated automatic rifles and mortar bombs. The Indian Army intervened and there was an exchange of heavy firing. Two Indian Army Jawan got injured.

SATURDAY, 24 JUNE, 2023**Kanglatongbi Village, District- Imphal West, Sub-division- Lamshang, Police Station- Sekmai Police Station.**

The only road leading to a buffer zone at the border of Kanglatongbi village was dug up by a mob led by the Meirapaibis, in the presence of Imphal West Police.

SUNDAY, 25 JUNE 2023**Itham Village, East Andro, District- Imphal East, Sub-division- Keirao Bitra, Police Station- Andro Police Station.**

In an operation launched by the Indian Army on the area, 12 KYKL cadres were apprehended along with arms, ammunition and War like stores. Self-styled, Lt. Col. Moirangthem Tamba alias Uttam (Mastermind of 6 DOGRA ambush case of 2015) was amongst the 12 apprehended cadres. However, a Meitei mob of over 1200-1500 led by Meirapaibis and local Meitei leaders surrounded the area and prevented Security Forces from going ahead with the operation after which the Indian Army handed over the 12 KYKL cadres over to the Meirapaibis.

MONDAY, 26 JUNE, 2023**(I) Chingmeirong, Imphal, District- Imphal East, Police Station- Chingmeirong Outpost, Imphal Police Station.**

Meitei terrorists burnt down Misao Gas Agency residence at Chingmeirong Mamang Leikai, Imphal. Property worth crores was gutted down in the arson.

(II) Imphal Secretariat, Imphal

The Manipur Government on Monday declared that the no-work-no-pay principle would apply to all government employees drawing salaries from the General Administration Department, Manipur Secretariat who are not attending office.

TUESDAY, 27 JUNE, 2023**(I) Mantripukhri, Imphal, District- Imphal West, Police Station- Heingang Police Station.**

Meitei terrorists burned down Kuki-Zo houses at Vaiphei Veng, Imphal. The houses burnt down are located near Christ Jyoti School, Mantripukhri, Imphal.

(II) Lamlongei, District- Imphal West, Police Station-Heingang Police station.

At around 11:00 p.m, Meitei miscreants burnt down EMP(Eastern Manipur Presbyterian) church, and one Kuki-Zo house after vandalizing and looting all the properties located at Lamlongei, Heingang (N. Biren Singh's Assembly Constituency).

THURSDAY, 29 JUNE , 2023**(I) Haraothel – Leilon/ Leimakhong Area, District- Kangpokpi District, Sub-division- SaituGamphazol, Police Station- Leimakhong Police Station.**

At around 5:30 a.m, firing started at L.Tanguam village. Central forces stationed in the area came under attack by Meitei militants. Firings were exchanged between the Indian Army and the Meitei militants later at L. Munlai village again. Three Meitei militants were killed in the crossfire and many injured. This was the 10th attempt by valley based terrorists to wipe out the Kuki-Zo villages in the said area.

(II) Bethel village, District- Kangpokpi, Sub-division- Kangchup Geljang, Police Station- Lamshang.

Bethel village had been previously attacked for the first time on Friday, 02 June, 2023 whereby Meitei terrorists had burnt down some part of the village. The second attack came on Thursday, 29 June, 2023 whereby the Meitei terrorists along with their radicalized youths burnt down the remaining homes and bulldozed and dismantled the local Church along with the remaining buildings in the village. Mr. Lenglam Dimngel of Ichaigojang Village, Saikul, Head Constable of Leimakhong Police Station was shot dead by Meitei terrorists at Kangchup Bethel near L.Tangnuam (Haraothel) village when the police team went there to verify the bodies of those killed in the firing at L. Tangnuam Village.

FRIDAY, 30 JUNE, 2023

CM Bungalow, Babupara, Imphal, Manipur, District- Imphal West, Police Station-Manipur Police Headquarter.

At around 2:20 p.m, N. Biren Singh in an attempt to consolidate his supporters within his own community staged a high profile political drama. Meirapaibis from different constituencies of his loyal BJP MLAs were brought to his bungalow to stage the drama along with him. In a video circulated of incident, Minister L. Susindro Meitei was seen reading out the resignation letter which was supposed to be submitted to the governor and using a loudspeaker he was seen asking the Meirapaibis to come to forward to tear down the resignation letter which he then handed over to some of the women who tore it. The armed militants, Arambai Tengol clad in their signature uniform i.e .black t-shirt with a red logo behind, were seen amongst the crowd demanding the reconsideration of the staged resignation. The previous night (Thursday, 29 June 2023), hundreds of womenfolk from the Meitei community discontent with the Biren Singh government had tried to storm into the CM's Bungalow. Manipur police accompanied by RAF personnel had dispersed the local Meirapaibis and mobs by firing tear gas shells.

SATURDAY, 01 JULY, 2023

Directorate of Education(s), Lamphelpat, District- Imphal West, Police Station- Lamphel Police Station.

Order was issued to reopen schools by the Director of Education (School) L. Nandakumar Singh on 21 June, 2023. However, the government had deferred the due date to 01 July, 2023.

SUNDAY, 02 JULY, 2023

Langza- Chinglangmei Village, Samulamlan Block, District- Churachandpur, Sub-division- Saikot, Police Station- Kumbi Police Station.

A fresh attack on Langza, a Kuki-Zo village began on midnight of 1st July 2023 and continued till Sunday morning by Meitei militants aided by Manipur state forces. Mr. David Thiek, a Hmar village volunteer was caught and tortured in the most gruesome way possible whereby his body was dismembered, throat slit and beheaded by Mr. Mairembam Romesh Mangang who was later seen carrying the chopped head of David in his hand. The culprit is PRO to Shanti Kumar alias Sh. Sanasam Premchandra Singh, BJP MLA of Kumbi Constituency in Bishnupur District.

MONDAY, 03 JULY, 2023**(I) Phaileng, Luwangsanggol, Thingsat, Mapao in Saikul sub-division of Kangpokpi District and Dampi area in Churachandpur district.**

Kuki-Zo villages in several districts across Manipur came under simultaneous attacks by Meitei militants and terrorists with the active involvement of State security forces using mortal bombs and sophisticated weapons.

(II) Lamka, District – Churachandpur , Police Station - Churachandpur Police Station.

A young Kuki-Zo woman by the name Ms. Lamneichong Khongsai of Kotsophai Village (Sugnu) in Chandel district died succumbing to childbirth complications due to inadequate health care and lack of medical facilities. The young mother-to-be was displaced when her home was attacked and burnt by Meiteis in the first week of June. She was in DM Veng Relief Camp at the time of her demise.

TUESDAY, 04 JULY 2023**Khangabok, District- Thoubal, Police Station- Thoubal Police Station.**

A Meitei mob in thousands attempted to loot weapons from the 3rd IRB at Khangabok in Thoubal district. It was successfully thwarted by the Indian Army. One Meitei was killed while a few others were injured during the failed attempt. Mob had laid roadblocks to prevent movement of reinforcements. However, additional columns of Assam Rifles and Rapid Action Force were able to induct and the situation was brought under control by synergized efforts of Security Forces.

WEDNESDAY, 05 JULY 2023**(I) Gangiphai-Phaileng area, District- Kangpokpi, Police Station- Kangpokpi Police Station.**

1. At around 4:30 a.m, Meitei armed militants i.e., Arambai Tengol started firing at the east of Phaileng and intermittent firing between Kuki-Zo defense volunteers and the Meitei attackers was reported. No casualty had been reported meanwhile central security forces were closely monitoring the situation.

(II) Kanglatongbi, District- Imphal West, Police Station- Sekmai Police Station.

More than 1500 Meira Paibis gathered at Kanglatongbi area approaching Kanglatongbi Bridge attempting to storm into Gangiphai area in the periphery between Imphal and Kangpokpi.

(III) Thoubal District,

A large unruly crowd of Meiteis continued their blockade of the National Highway no. 102 in Thoubal district as a protest against the death of Mr. Abujam Ronaldo who died while trying to loot 3rd IRB on 4th July, 2023.

(IV) SAFF Championship, Sree Kanteerava Stadium, Bangalore, Karnataka.

Mr. Jeakson Singh, a Meitei footballer and part of the Indian National Team was seen adorning the Salai Taret Flag that signifies Meitei nationalism and has been used by Meitei secessionists to rally public support within the Meitei community behind their anti-India agenda. This flag has been seen hoisted on top of Kuki-Zo Churches and localities in the aftermath of attacks by Meiteis. The Salai Taret flag was also seen on top of the Indian National Flag in the stand.

THURSDAY, 06 JULY 2023**(I) Khongnangpokpi, District- Kangpokpi, Sub-division- Saikul, Police Station- Saikul**

At around 10:50 a.m., reports came that twelve youths (2 girls, and 10 boys) from the Kom community had been abducted by Meitei militants in Khongnangpokpi Village. The news was shared by fleeing villagers who narrowly escaped the clutches of the Meitei militants. Properties such as a white alto car, gas cylinder, and livestock were also reportedly stolen by the Meitei intruders.

(II) Saibol Village, District-Tengnoupal, Police Station- Tengnoupal Police Station

At around 6:00 p.m, a heavy exchange of firing between 20 Assam Rifles and cadres of proscribed Meitei terrorist group RPF/PLA was reported. Saibol Village is located 25.1 km away from the border town of Moreh.

(III) Kwakeithel Mayai Koibi, District-Imphal West, Police Station- Kwakeithel Police Station

A Kuki-Zo tribal woman by the name Mrs. Donngaihching, in her 60s who was living in Lamphel locality was shot dead by two Meitei militants and was left on the road at Kwakeithel in Imphal outside Shishu Nishtha Niketan School. She was mentally challenged and refused to leave with her relatives when the violence broke out on 3rd May.

(IV) Dongjang Village, Sangaikot Block, District- Churachandpur, Police Station- Sangaikot Police Station.

Bunkers set up by local village defense volunteers in Dongjang village were destroyed by a joint team of State and Central security forces.

(V) Leitanpokpi foothills bordering Kangpokpi and Imphal

In an operation conducted between 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 pm, a combined team of Imphal East District Police, Assam Rifles, and BSF destroyed seven bunkers at Purum Hills.

FRIDAY, 07 JULY 2023**(I) Imphal, Manipur.**

Meitei singer Mr. Jayenta Loukrakpam also known as Tapta released a genocidal song against the Kuki-Zo tribals. The lyrics revealed a strong presence of xenophobia, prejudice, bigotry, racism, and discrimination toward the Kuki-Zo people. He accused the Indian army of indulging in inappropriate behavior with Kuki-Zo women and taking sides. He concludes by saying that even if peace is made, we (Meiteis) will not stop this war until every Kuki-Zo is wiped out completely.

(II) Kangvai area, Lamka, District-Churachandpur, Police Station-Churachandpur Police Station.

At around 1- 4:00 am, two young Kuki-Zo village defense volunteers namely Mr. Hengoumang Lungdim and Mr. Sokhongam Baite lost their lives while defending their villages against Meitei armed intruders. Meanwhile, three village volunteers were also injured in the attack. Volunteers in their witness accounts reported the alleged involvement of Manipur Police Commandos along with their official vehicles accompanying and aiding the Meitei terrorists who had attacked their villages.

SATURDAY, 08 JULY 2023**Imphal.**

In an attempt by the Meiteis to silence the Kuki-Zo tribal minorities, FIR has been filed against several Kuki-Zo tribal leaders who have been vocal on the ethnic pogrom against Kuki-Zo tribals in Manipur.

1. The Manipur home department has asked the police to take action against members of the Zomi Students' Federation (ZSF) who had published the book, 'The Inevitable Split: Documents on State-Sponsored Ethnic Cleansing in Manipur, 2023'. An FIR was filed against ZSF by a Meitei man, Mr. Thokchom Punshiba Singh of Thangmeiband Lourung Pural Leikai on 22nd June 2023.
2. An FIR was filed against Dr. Mary Grace Zou, Convenor of Kuki Women's Forum by one Lourembam Cha Somerendro, a man who claims to be a social worker. Dr. Zou was summoned by the Imphal East District court for the interview she had given on 14th June 2023.
3. On similar grounds, FIR was registered by the same person Lourembam Cha Somerendro against Wilson Lalam Hangshing, General Secretary of the Kuki People's Alliance (KPA) who had given an interview on 26th May 2023.
4. Prof. Kham Khan Suan Hausing had given an interview in Karan Thapar's Talk Show on 17th June 2023. Prof. Hausing was summoned by the Imphal East district court on 6 July after its Chief judicial magistrate, Ms. Ashem Tarunakumari Devi took cognizance of an FIR filed by one Mr. Manihar Moirangthem Singh, a member of Meitei Tribes Union (MTU).
5. Similarly, FIR was registered against the three-member fact-finding team of the National Federation of Indian Women (NFIW) under Manipur Police by one Mr. S. Liben Singh of Heingang Makha Leikai. The team consisted of Annie Raja (General Secretary, NFIW), Nisha Sindhu, (National Secretary, NFIW), and Independent Advocate Ms. Deeksha Dwivedi.

MONDAY, 10 JULY 2023**Lamka, District- Churachandpur, Police Station- Churachandpur Police Station.**

The Assam Rifles registered a case of sedition and defamation against the chief of COCOMI, Meitei CSO for promoting enmity between groups and for giving a call to people not to surrender weapons that have been looted from state armories and police stations across the Imphal Valley.

TUESDAY, 11 JULY 2023**(I) Kakching Bazar, District- Kakching, Police Station- Kakching Police Station.**

At around 6:00 p.m, thousands of Meiteis gathered at Kakching Bazar proclaiming Meitei nationalism and shouting religious Sanamahism slogans in an attempt to encourage and mobilize Meitei Youths against Kuki-Zo tribals. They shouted slogans like "Ibudhou Pakhangbana Yaiphare, Ima Leibakna Yaiphare".

(II)Sega Road, Thouda Bhabok Leikai, Keishamthong, District- Imphal West, Police Station-

Various Imphal-based news media including the Hueiyen Lanpao in their headlines had deliberately twisted a report from the Superintendent of Police (SP), Churachandpur, that Myanmar nationals were involved in the current ethnic conflict in Manipur. Police sources in Lamka had clarified that it was a case of medical emergency due to violence in neighboring Myanmar and has nothing to do with the ongoing turmoil.

FRIDAY, 14 JULY 2023**Khongnangpokpi- Thingsat area, District- Kangpokpi, Sub-division-Saikul, Police Station-**

At around 5:00 p.m, Meitei terrorists disguised as Manipur State Security Forces were reportedly seen infiltrating Khongnangpokpi and Thingsat areas in Kangpokpi district. Khongnangpokpi, a Kuki-Zo village is in close proximity to Mapao Tangkhul village and the nearest Meitei settlement is Sekmai in Imphal West district.

SATURDAY, 15 JULY 2023**(I) Sawombung, Khundrakpam Assembly Constituency, District- Imphal East, Police Station- Lamlai Police Station.**

57-year-old Mrs. Lucy Maring, a native of Narum village in Tengenoupal district and a resident of National Games Village Zone-III was murdered by Meitei militants suspected to be members of the Arambai Tenggol.

(II) Sekmai, District-Imphal West, Police Station- Sekmai Police Station.

At around 12:00 pm, Meitei Womenfolk (Meirapaibis) burned down three trucks carrying LPG cylinders of the Misao Gas Agency. The trucks had been stranded at IOC's gas plant in Sekmai since May 3.

SUNDAY, 16 JULY 2023**(I) Laimaton Thangbuh Village, District- Kangpokpi, Sub-Division-Bungte Chiru, Police Station- New Keithelmanbi Police Station.**

At around 9:00 a.m, 40 to 50 Armed Meitei militants stormed Laimaton Thangbuh, a Kuki-Zo village in Kangpokpi district where a 32 year-old Kuk-Zo man named Mr. Jangkholun Haokip was shot dead by the Meitei militants. L. Thangbuh is located approximately 5-6 km away from Keinou a Meitei locality in Bishnupur district. Security forces reported an exchange of fire in the foothills. Army units deployed in the vicinity rushed to the village but were blocked and pushed back from entering the hills by the Meitei womenfolk- Meirapaibis who had gathered in large numbers.

(II) Phaileng area, District- Kangpokpi, Police Station- Saikul Police Station.

A joint team of Indian Army, Police, and CRPF were fired upon by Meitei militants while conducting an operation in the ridge adjoining Kangpokpi and Imphal West districts.

(III) Kanggui, District-Kangpokpi, Police Station- Kangpokpi Police Station.

COTU reinstated a 72-hour shutdown, barring all vehicular movement except emergency services following the violence against the Kuki-Zo tribals, including the torching of gas trucks and non-stop attacks on Kuki-Zo villages. Despite previous de-escalation efforts, the blockade was reimposed due to the State government's inability to control violence from the Meitei side. Meanwhile, access to Kuki-Zo inhabited areas remains obstructed by Meirapaibis-led Meitei mobs hindering the transport of essential goods and medical supplies from reaching Kuki-Zo inhabited areas.

MONDAY, 17 JULY 2023**(I) Kwakeithel area, District-Imphal West, Police Station – Kwakeithel Police Station.**

Inspector General of Police Shri.Kabib K, a 2005 batch IPS officer was attacked and his convoy torched down by Meitei mob at Kwakeithel in Imphal West district.

(II) Tilak Marg, New Delhi.

The Supreme Court extended by four weeks its interim order protecting a woman lawyer, Mrs. Dwiksha Dwivedi, from arrest in a sedition case registered against her after she visited violence-hit Manipur as part of a fact-finding team of the National Federation of Indian Women (NFIW). The report had termed the current violence as a State-sponsored riot.

TUESDAY, 18 JULY 2023**(I) MTFD meets Governor to address deteriorating situation**

Representatives of Manipur Tribals' Forum, Delhi (MTFD) met with Manipur Governor Shri Anusuiya Uikey in New Delhi to discuss the worsening conditions in Manipur. The MTFD team expressed gratitude for the Governor's peace efforts and conveyed their concerns about the state's situation. The Governor emphasized the importance of exploring all avenues to restore peace and urged the tribal leaders to engage in an internal dialogue with their community leaders for meaningful talks. She assured that peace would be restored in Manipur through a constructive dialogue process.

(II) Meira Paibis stage protest in Imphal

In Imphal's Singjamei area, hundreds of Meirapaibis protested and attempted to march toward the Chief Minister's secretariat to demand conflict resolution. Security forces stopped them, leading to violent rioting and tear gas use. The Meirapaibis were displeased for being denied a meeting with the Chief Minister, contrasting a previous meeting. They sought urgent resolution and expressed sorrow for Meitei's losses during the ethnic conflict, with relatives of militants killed in a church desecration at Khamenlok among the protestors.

TUESDAY, 18 JULY 2023**(I) Molestation video of 2 Kuki-Zo women by Meitei men goes viral (B. Phainom (Kuki-Zo Village), District – Kangpokpi, Sub-Division- Island, Police Station – Nongpok Sekmai)**

1. A bone-chilling video of two Kuki-Zo women being molested and paraded naked by thousands of Meitei men made national headlines, causing an unprecedented uproar that drew flak from all quarters.
2. Representatives from various political parties have united to denounce the incident and criticize both the Central and State governments for permitting such heinous acts against women. Calls for Chief Minister N. Biren Singh's resignation had emerged from multiple sources.

(II) Bethel village, District- Kangpokpi, Sub-division- Kangchup Geljang, Police Station- Lamshang.

A five-member fact-finding team of All India Trinamool Congress (TMC) Members of Parliament (MPs) visited Manipur for a two-day assessment of the state's violence-stricken condition. The team, led by prominent TMC figures like Derek O'Brien and Kalyan Banerjee, visited memorial sites, and relief camps, and expressed their intention to address the Manipur issue in the upcoming parliamentary session. Their visit aimed to understand the grievances of the people and promote peace in the region.

THURSDAY, 20 JULY 2023

(I) Manipur issue raised in UK parliament

Expressing dissatisfaction with the insufficient global attention on Manipur, MP Fiona Bruce, UK PM Rishi Sunak's special envoy for freedom of religion or belief (FROB), raised concerns regarding the Manipur violence during a House of Commons session. She referenced a report presented to the International Religious Freedom or Belief Alliance (IRFBA) by former BBC reporter David Campanale. According to Bruce, the report outlined distressing facts: a significant number of churches destroyed, numerous burnt down, over 100 casualties, more than 50,000 people displaced, and deliberate targeting of schools and seminaries.

(II) Prime Minister Modi breaks silence on Manipur violence

After remaining silent on Manipur for more than two months, Prime Minister Narendra Modi finally spoke out today, expressing his condemnation of the incident wherein two Kuki-Zo women were molested and paraded naked. He stated that the violence has brought shame to India and is an insult to the entire nation.

(III) Monsoon Session of Parliament begins on a stormy note

As the Monsoon Session of Parliament was scheduled to commence today, it kicked off with a tumultuous atmosphere as both Houses of Parliament were adjourned due to uproar over the Manipur violence. Members of the opposition called for the day's proceedings to be halted in order to address the Manipur issue.

(IV) Supreme Court expresses grave concerns over Constitutional abuse

In a matter of significant concern, the Supreme Court has weighed in, expressing profound disturbance over the issue. Characterizing it as the "grossest of constitutional abuse", the entire court conveyed their strong dismay. They urged the relevant authorities to take immediate action, cautioning that if no action is taken, the court would find itself compelled to intervene.

(V) Main accused in viral molestation video arrested

The main culprit who was wearing a green t-shirt and seen holding the woman was arrested in an operation after proper identification. His name is Mr. Huirem Herodas Meitei of Pechi Awang Leikai.

(VI) Nationwide protests against molestation of Kuki-Zo women

1. Following the viral video depicting the humiliating parade of two Kuki-Zo tribal women in Manipur, protests swept across India. Despite heavy monsoon rains, a multitude of demonstrators gathered in Lamka on Thursday. They passionately chanted slogans, urging justice for the victims, denouncing the passivity and involvement of the Manipur government, and advocating for an independent administration for the Kuki-Zo community within Manipur.
2. A sit-in protest was organized by members of Tangkhul Shanao Long, who gathered at the Mini-Secretariat in Ukhrul. They strongly condemned the dehumanizing actions of Meitei men towards tribal women. During the protest, they raised slogans urging the police to take responsibility and ensure the protection of women amidst the ongoing conflict.
3. In Patna, students participated in a candlelight march, displaying placards that called for justice for the victims, appropriate punishment for the culprits, and an end to the Manipur violence.
4. In Bengaluru, the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) organized a protest to denounce the atrocities against tribal women in Manipur.
5. Meanwhile, in Kolkata, members of the Congress party protested and engaged in a brief altercation with the State police.
6. In Delhi, the Indian Youth Congress clashed with the Delhi police while attempting to stage a protest outside the Indian Parliament. Additionally, the Mahila Congress held a rally, demanding the restoration of peace in Manipur.

FRIDAY, 21 JULY 2023

(I) PAMRA urges Meiteis in Mizoram to depart for their own safety

A former militant group in Mizoram, Peace Accord MNF Returnees' Association (PAMRA) has urged the Meiteis camping in the state of Mizoram to depart the state for their own safety. The statement comes after a video of two Kuki-Zo women being paraded naked and molested surfaced on July 19.

(II) Women set fire to house of main accused in viral video

Women from the village of the main accused in the viral molestation video case Mr. Huirem Herodas Meitei, vandalized and set ablaze a kutcha house alleged to be his house.

SATURDAY, 22 JULY 2023**(I) Torbung (Kuki-Zo Village), District – Churachandpur, Sub-Division- Kangvai, Police Station - Kangvai**

At around 5:00 pm, armed Meitei terrorists and militants set fire to the Children's Treasure High School, Torbung which belonged to the Kuki-Zo community. This led to clashes between Kuki-Zo volunteers and Meitei terrorists in the border areas, resulting in at least 5 mortar firings from the Meitei side, as reported by ground sources.

(II) Joint Unau Students' Forum Delhi holds protest

Students and individuals from the Kuki-Zo community protested at Jantar Mantar, Delhi, against the ethnic cleansing of Kuki-Zo tribals in Manipur. They urged the central government's intervention, sought the resignation of Manipur's Chief Minister for his alleged involvement, and reiterated the demand for Separate Administration as a solution. The protest drew a large crowd of Kuki-Zo tribals and other supporters.

(III) Fifth Meitei rapist arrested

In relation to the viral video from 19th July depicting the shameful incident of two Kuki-Zo tribal women being paraded naked and subjected to gang rape by Meitei men, the Manipur Police has apprehended a fifth individual. The person taken into custody is Mr. Yumlembam Ningsithoi Meitei.

SUNDAY, 23 JULY 2023**(I) Solidarity Rally in Shillong**

Residents of Shillong, Meghalaya, united on Sunday to show support for victims of ethnic violence in Manipur. The candlelight vigil took place at Don Bosco Square and drew a significant turnout from diverse backgrounds. Attendees chanted slogans, displayed signs advocating justice and peace in strife-ridden Manipur, and denounced the acts of sexual violence and atrocities against women. Criticism was aimed at the Biren Singh-led government's inability to maintain law and order and the perceived inaction of the Central government. Some participants also held placards calling for Separate Administration for Kuki-Zo tribals. The event was graced by prominent journalist Mrs. Patricia Mukhim and social activist Mrs. Angela Rangad.

MONDAY, 24 JULY 2023**(I) DCW Chairperson visits Lamka, Churachandpur**

Delhi Commission for Women (DCW) Chairperson Mrs. Swati Maliwal and member Mrs. Vandana Singh visited Imphal, where they inspected relief camps and met survivors of sexual assault from the Kuki-Zo community. Mrs. Maliwal expressed disappointment at the lack of support and rehabilitation from Manipur government officials for the survivors. She questioned why Manipur's CM hadn't visited the victims of ethnic violence despite her own visit without security. Maliwal urged PM Narendra Modi and Union Minister Smriti Irani to visit the state and understand the situation. She also met with Manipur's governor to share her observations, despite the government's request to postpone her visit due to "law and order" concerns.

TUESDAY, 25 JULY 2023**(I) NCW Chief visits Lamka**

The National Commission for Women (NCW), headed by Chairperson Rekha Sharma, visited Lamka to assess the situation of tribal women facing violence in the ongoing Manipur ethnic conflict. Chairperson Sharma met privately with two women who had experienced viral internet backlash due to their ordeal, promising to investigate and bring to justice both the perpetrators of the crimes and the involved police personnel. She also met with families of other women survivors and victims. She concluded her visit after meeting various Women's Civil Society Organisations based in Lamka.

(II) Solidarity events held for Kuki-Zo tribals across India

1. Under the aegis of the NGO Coordination Committee, a conglomerate of five major civil society organizations including the Central Young Mizo Association (CYMA) and Mizo Zirlai Pawl (MZP), tens of thousands of people marched at different locations in Mizoram, including the capital of Aizawl. Mizoram Chief Minister Zoramthanga, his Ministers, and MLAs of the Mizoram Assembly, all participated in the protest, and all political parties in the State also closed their offices for the day to extend their support for the cause. Over ₹ 10 lakhs was raised during the protest in Aizawl which will be used to provide humanitarian support to the Kuki-Zo people in Manipur.
2. The Kuki Inpi, Nagaland, observed a candlelight vigil and prayer today for their Kuki-Zo ethnic kins of Manipur, at Ahthibung Town Square.
3. The Kuki-Zo community of Jampui Hills, North Tripura on Tuesday observed a candlelight vigil program to show solidarity with their Kuki-Zo ethnic brethren of Manipur. They submitted a memorandum to the Union and Tripura Government condemning the horrifying incidents in Manipur since May 3, 2023, and demanding swift and impartial justice for the tribal victims of these heinous acts.
4. A candlelight vigil and rally had also been organized by the Arunachal Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) on Tuesday. The gathering called for justice to be delivered to the Kuki-Zo tribals, for the resignation of Biren Singh from the Chief-Ministership, and condemned the PM's silence on the Manipur issue.
5. The International Human Rights Council, Kiphire Board, and Kiphire Inter Collegiate Evangelical Union also held an event to show their solidarity with the people of Manipur torn apart by the ethnic conflict. The gathering emphasized on Love as the path to finding solutions and Peace as a fundamental human right for everyone.
6. Thousands of Kuki-Zo women also organized a rally in Dima Hasao, Assam, under the aegis of the All Dima Hasao Joint Women's Organization (ADHJWO), condemning the violence inflicted on the Kuki-Zo people of Manipur, particularly the barbaric atrocities against the womenfolk.

(III) Internet Restrictions Eased in Manipur

The Manipur Home Department has partially lifted the internet ban in the state, which had been in place since May 3, 2023. The decision was made to allow common people to access essential online services. The ban has been lifted for broadband services like Internet Lease Line (ILL) and Fiber To The Home (FTTH) but with certain conditions such as using static IP and restricting access to wifi, hotspot services, social media platforms, and VPN software. However, the ban on mobile internet continues to remain in effect.

WEDNESDAY, 26 JULY 2023

(I) Political Talks with Kuki-Zo armed groups held

Government representatives, including former Intelligence Bureau director Akshay Mishra, held discussions with United People's Front (UPF) and Kuki National Organisation (KNO) representatives in New Delhi. The talks aimed to reduce violence in Manipur and find a political solution for the Kuki-Zo tribal community. Kuki-Zo armed groups, currently in a Suspension of Operations (SoO) agreement with the Indian government, expressed positivity about the talks' outcome. Simultaneously, Kuki-Zo people in Kangpokpi showed support for the talks through a gathering organized by the Committee on Tribal Unity (COTU).

(II) Kangvai (Kuki Village), District – Churachandpur, Sub-Division- Kangvai, Police Station - Kangvai/Churachandpur

After the Meitei terror attacks on Kuki-Zo villages around Kangvai, a series of further attacks by Meitei militant groups occurred, with mortar bombs and snipers being used. Kuki-Zo village defenders suspect either stolen police mortars or collaboration between Meitei Police Commandos and terrorists. The attacks resulted in casualties, including injuries and the death of a village defender Mr. Lunminthang, along with the burning of houses.

(III) Tensions escalate in Moreh following high-handedness of the police

Tensions escalated in Moreh, a Manipur border town, between the Kuki-Zo community and Manipur Police Commando. The police assaulted Kuki-Zo women during curfew relaxation, leading to protests. The situation escalated further as the irate women set abandoned houses on fire, prompting police to fire on them. A gunfight ensued between Kuki-Zo volunteers and the police, resulting in a police personnel's death.

(IV) Mizo MP Pu K. Vanlalvena calls for discussion on Manipur violence

Rajya Sabha MP from Mizoram, Pu K. Vanlalvena, requested the Chairman of Rajya Sabha for adjournment of the House's business on July 26 under Rule 267, aiming to discuss the ongoing violence in Manipur. This is the third such request from the MP during the current session, with previous requests on July 24 as well.

THURSDAY, 27 JULY 2023

(I) Khongsang Area, District-Tamenglong, Police Station- Khongsang, Sub-Division - Nungba

A Zero FIR was filed against Ginza Vualzong, Media & Publicity, ITLF in Imphal West by Mr. Shanta Singh Nahakpam.

(II) Lamka, District- Churachandpur, Police Station- Churachandpur Police Station.

The Joint Students' Body (JSB) of Kuki-Zo student organizations in Lamka wrote to the Manipur Governor requesting transfer for Kuki-Zo students to other universities and arrangements of offline classes for Masters Students in hill districts and exam facilities in the area.

(III) London, United Kingdom

The Women of North East India Support Network (WNESM) in London protested against the brutal acts committed by Meitei men against Kuki-Zo tribal women. They marched silently from India House to the UK Parliament to condemn the human rights violations, particularly the public humiliation of two Kuki-Zo women in B. Phainom village in Kangpokpi district. The video had been recorded on 4th May and had gone viral earlier on 19th July. The protest aimed to symbolically stand against these gross violations, particularly targeting helpless tribal women.

FRIDAY, 28 JULY, 2023

(I) Thoubal Area (District - Thoubal, Police Station - Thoubal, Sub-Division - Thoubal)

1. A protest rally conducted by the Thoubal district Apunba Club and Meirapaibis on Friday condemned the arrest of several accused in the recent viral rape video case by Thoubal district police and called for stopping any further arrests in the case.
2. Around 10:30 a.m, the protest rally came from two sides - one from Wangjing side and the other from Thoubal side and met at Thoubal Deputy Commissioner Office in Thoubal Athokpam.
3. Later, SP Thoubal Sachidananda Soibam, MPS and AC to DC K. Lenin, MCS, on behalf of DC Thoubal came out to meet the protesters and gave assurance that their demands will be fulfilled.

(II) KWOHR stage protest at Wall of Remembrance

Today, at Lamka's Wall of Remembrance, the Kuki Women Organisation for Human Rights (KWOHR) staged a protest addressing the ongoing ethnic violence sponsored by the State. The focus of the gathering was to denounce the acts of sexual violence inflicted upon Kuki-Zo women by Meitei men amidst the ongoing conflict.

(III) Kuki-Zo Women's Forum, Delhi and NCR hold peaceful rally

The Kuki-Zo Women's Forum (KZWF), Delhi and NCR, held a peaceful rally in Delhi at New Delhi's Jantar Mantar. The protest focused on Kuki-Zo women victims of Meitei majoritarian violence and called for a Separate Administration as the only Solution for the Kuki-Zo community of Manipur.

SATURDAY, 29 JULY 2023

(I) INDIA Opposition MPs Assess Ground Realities

A delegation of 21 MPs from the opposition bloc INDIA reached here on Saturday to assess ground realities. On the first day of their visit, the Opposition delegation went to four relief camps, two in Churachandpur, one in Imphal, and one in Moirang.

(II) Manipur Governor Visits Lamka

The Governor of Manipur, Smt. Anusuiya Uikey, visited Lamka today for the second time after 3rd May to interact with displaced survivors from relief centers. She also met with the two survivors of the sexual violence and assured to extend all possible support to them in their fight for justice. She later interacted with leaders of different CSOs who submitted memorandums and demanded justice for all victims of sexual violence in the ongoing conflict. The demand for a political solution in the form of a Separate Administration was also reiterated.

SUNDAY, 30 JULY 2023

Palace Compound, Imphal.

In an event organized by the Federation of Civil Society Organisation (FOCS), retired session Judge Aribam Noutuneshwari was seen instigating the women crowd- the Meirapaibis to infiltrate buffer zones and storm into Kuki-Zo inhabited areas of Kanggui and Lamka. She encouraged them to march in the forefront as human shields to be followed by Meitei men as their militants have had difficulty infiltrating into the said tribal areas. Earlier, Meirapaibis had announced their intention to rally into Kuki-Zo inhabited areas under the guise of peace.

MONDAY, 31 JULY 2023

(I) Supreme Court Hearing

Petitions on several aspects of Manipur violence including the case of the two Kuki-Zo women survivors of sexual violence were heard today in the Supreme Court. In the hearing, the Supreme Court called for evolving a broad mechanism to deal with violence committed against women in the Manipur violence.

(II) Molestation Case: Four sent to CBI custody

On completion of the police custody period, the four accused identified as Mr. Huirem Herodas of Pechi Awang Leikai, Mr. Arun Khundongbam of Shikhong Bazar, Mr. Yumlembam Jiban of Nongpok Sekmai Awang Leikai and Mr. Ningombam Tomba of Pechi Awang Leikai were produced before the Court of Special Judge (SC&ST and Prevention of Atrocity Act) Thoubal at Cheirap Court with a prayer for remanding them to judicial custody.

(III) Tengenoupal District Headquarters

Kuki-Zo women in Tengenoupal had been protesting against the deployment of Meitei policemento Moreh and Kuki-Zo inhabited hill districts since 28th July. The central government finally agreed to deploy the 4th Gorkha Regiment of the Indian Army which was received with positive response by the locals.

(IV)North AOC Area, District-Imphal West,Police Station- Porompat Police Station.

At around 9:30 p.m, Meitei arsonist mobs allegedly burned down the remaining Kuki-Zo houses at Canaan Veng, Zomi Villa, and other Kuki-Zo localities.

(V)Arts Faculty, North Campus, University of Delhi.

Concerned students of Delhi University organized a Candlelight vigil in solidarity with the Kuki-Zo tribal women who had been subjected to sexual atrocities.

TUESDAY,01 AUGUST 2023

Tilak Marg, Mandi House, New Delhi

Solicitor-General Tushar Mehta appearing for both the Union and Manipur governments told the Supreme Court that most of the unclaimed bodies are of infiltrators who came with a particular design and got killed.

THURSDAY,03 AUGUST, 2023

(I) Bishnupur district, Manipur.

Huge quantities of arms and ammunition, including twenty-five INSAS rifles, forty-eight INSAS LMGs, an AK Rifle, three Ghatak Rifles, one hundred ninety-five SLRs, sixteen pistols, one hundred twenty-four hand grenades, one hundred twenty-four detonators, twenty-five bullet-proof jackets, twenty-three GF Rifles, and three 51mm mortars were looted from the 2nd IRB headquarters at Naranseina and two police outposts- at Keirenphabi and Thangalawei in Bishnupur district. Attempts were also made to loot 2nd and 7th Battalion Manipur Rifles but were repelled by security forces.

(II) Kwakta, District- Bishnupur, Police Station- Phougakchaolkhai Police Station.

Hundreds of Meira Paibis led Meitei mobs tried to storm into Lamka to disrupt the funeral procession organized by the ITLF at S. Boljang village near HaolaiKhopi. In the scuffle that unfolded between the Central security forces and the Manipur State force visible from the ground report video of India Today, Meitei women were seen throwing stones and wooden blocks at the RAF and Army. Meanwhile, State forces were also seen blank firing at the central security forces deployed at the buffer zone.

(III) Kanggui Bazar, District- Kangpokpi, Police Station- Kangpokpi Police Station.

An order was issued by the state government to withdraw Central security forces from Kuki-Zo dominated areas across Manipur which the Kuki-zo tribal populace vehemently opposed. Kuki-Zo women of Kangpokpi town gathered in large numbers pleading the Assam Rifles posted in the area not to leave the already vulnerable tribals.

FRIDAY, 04 AUGUST, 2023

A Meitei Facebook page by the name Kangleipak Kanba Lup on Friday proclaimed their stand on the ongoing ethnic cleansing against the Kuki-zo tribal minorities. The points posted were as follows:

1. To remove Kuki-Zo tribals from the ST list
2. To render the entire Kuki-Zo tribals as Refugees
3. To prevent Kuki-Zo tribals from contesting in elections
4. To stop at all cost the Kuki-Zo tribals from getting government jobs.

SATURDAY, 05 AUGUST, 2023**(I) Gothol Area, Sub-division- Kangvai, District- Churachandpur, Police Station- Churachandpur Police Station.**

Meitei militants in cohorts with the Manipur State Police forces attacked P. Geljang and Gothol, both Kuki-Zo Villages near Kwakta which is the border between Lamka and Bishnupur district. The two villages were attacked using mortar bombs and sophisticated weapons. The attack rendered four Kuki-Zo volunteers dead, while leaving seven village volunteers injured. Meitei mobs also burnt down several vacant houses belonging to Kuki-Zo tribals at Ukhatampak.

(II) Guwahati, Assam.

Mr. Thanggoulen Lhouvum, a 16-year-old Kuki-Zo tragically passed away at GNRC hospital in Guwahati where he had been receiving treatment for his injuries. He was shot in the stomach by Manipur police commandos at Moreh on 28th May 2023. He was airlifted to Leimakhong for initial medical care but his condition necessitated his airlift to Guwahati where he had been receiving treatment until he succumbed to his injuries.

(III) Langol Area, Imphal, District- Imphal West, Police Station- Lamphel Police Station.

At around 5:00 p.m, Phaipijang in Langol and localities such as Gamngei Veng, Hebron Veng, Hillside Colony, Joseph Colony, Vaiphei Enclave, Naims Colony, and parts of Spring Villa and Government quarters occupied by Kuki-Zo tribals in Langol Housing Complex E-Sector was razed to the ground by Meiteis. More than 40 two-wheelers and more than 10 four-wheelers were stolen from the said area on Wednesday, 02 August 2023.

(IV) Songdo and Phuolzang Village, District- Churachandpur, Police Station- Churachandpur Police Station.

In another attempt to infiltrate into the Kuki-Zo inhabited areas of Lamka, two villages namely Songdo and Phuolzang Villages were attacked with arms and ammunition looted from the 2nd IRB in Moirang. They rained down bullets on the Kuki-Zo volunteers which resulted in the loss of two volunteers and injury to twelve others.

SUNDAY, 06 AUGUST, 2023**Mohali district, Punjab.**

The Bhartiya Kisan Union (Ekta-Ugrahan) -Punjab Farmer's Organisation organized a massive rally as a protest against the violence on Kuki-Zo tribal communities by the majority Meitei-centric government of Manipur.

MONDAY, 07 AUGUST, 2023**Kwakta, Bishnupur District**

A local masjid (mosque), a sacred place of worship for the Meitei Pangals in Kwakta has been repurposed as a bunker by the Meitei State Security Forces and Meitei armed groups despite the local Pangal's opposition and request to shift their bunker to a nearby LP school in the same vicinity.

TUESDAY, 08 AUGUST, 2023**Chingphei-Pangjang-Sejang village, District- Churachandpur, Sub-Division-Kangvai, Police Station- Churachandpur Police Station.**

At around 5:30 a.m, Kuki-Zo villages located in the periphery between Churachandpur and Bishnupur districts came under heavy military attack by a combined Meitei police commandos, Meitei terrorists and Meitei militants who burnt several Kuki-Zo houses down to ashes. Chingphei shares a boundary with Meitei localities such as Phubala and Thinungei in Bishnupur district. The Meitei aggressors fled to safety with the arrival of Central forces.

SATURDAY, 12 AUGUST, 2023**Thangmeiband Sinam Leikai Chingkhong, District- Imphal West, Police Station- Lamphel Police Station.**

An auto rickshaw (MN01-U5-447) driven by Mr. Muhammad Tiken of Porompat Pangal Leirak was set on fire by Meitei mobs based on allegations that he was transporting clothes and other items belonging to Kuki-Zo.

SUNDAY, 13 AUGUST, 2023**Imphal, Manipur.**

The Coordination Committee (CorCom), an umbrella group for Meitei militants has declared a boycott of India's Independence Day celebration in Manipur. As in previous years, the banned terrorist groups called for a General Strike from 1:00 a.m. till 6:00 p.m. The committee asserted that Manipur is not part of India and has been fighting for a sovereign Meitei country- Kangleipak.

MONDAY, 14 AUGUST, 2023**Kwakta, District- Bishnupur district, Police Station- Phougakchao Ikhai Police Station.**

A Muslim man from Kwakta was allegedly abducted and shot at by Meitei armed militants on allegations that he has been in touch with the Kuki-Zo.

TUESDAY, 15 AUGUST, 2023**(I) Parliament Square, London, United Kingdom**

The Kuki-Zo Unau tribals held a protest against the ethnic cleansing of the Kuki-Zo tribal minorities in Manipur since the 3rd of May 2023.

(II) Kangpokpi District

The Kuki-Zo tribals of Kangpokpi district came together to celebrate the 77th Independence Day at Kanggui's Thomas ground.

(III) Lamka, Churachandpur District.

Kuki-Zo tribals of Churachandpur district came together to celebrate the 77th Independence Day at Lamka Peace ground with grandeur.

WEDNESDAY, 16 AUGUST, 2023**Leimakhong Area, District- Kangpokpi, Police Station- Leimakhong Police Station.**

Intermittent and sporadic firing by Meitei militants was reported in the adjoining hills near Bethel, and Haraothel Kuki villages since Monday 14th August in the periphery region bordering Imphal West with Kangpokpi district.

THURSDAY, 17 AUGUST, 2023**(I) Langol, District- Imphal West, Police Station- Lamphel.**

EBCC, a Kuki-Zo church in Langol has been turned into a relief camp and the area of government quarters inhabited by the Kuki-Zo government employees was changed into Leima Khullen Leikai.

(II) Jantar Mantar, New Delhi

As a part of 'Global Week of Actions', a rally was organized by the Manipur Tribals Forum Delhi. Protests had already begun in different parts of the world (US and Europe).

FRIDAY, 18 AUGUST, 2023**(I) Thowai (Thawai) Kuki, District- Kamjong, Sub-division- Phungyar, Police Station- Litan Police Station.**

At around 04:30 a.m, a combined team of Meitei terrorist groups KYKL and Manipur Naga People's Front (MNPF) attacked Thowai (Kuki-Zo village) and mercilessly butchered three village volunteers namely Mr. Jamkhogin Haokip, Mr. Thangkhokai Haokip and Mr. Hollenson Baite in the most barbaric manner. Thowai village is located between Yaingangpokpi and Litan in Imphal to Ukhrul road and nearby villages include Shangikai, a Kuki-Zo Village and New Cannon, a Tangkhul Village.

(II) Lamphel Supermarket, District- Imphal West, Police Station- Lamphel Police Station.

House of former MP Shri Thangso Baite in Lamphel Supermarket which was a few meters away from the Lamphel Police station was burned by Meitei mobs. In a video circulating regarding the arson, police personnels were seen watching as mute spectators.

(III) Yairipok, District- Thoubal, Police Station- Yairipok Police Station.

At around 2:00 p.m, three Muslim youths were shot in their legs by Meitei armed miscreants and were left at Yairipok Charangpat road tri-junction. They were accused of being drug users and traders.

(IV) Moreh , District- Tengnoupal, Police Station- Moreh Police Station.

A total of 212 Meiteis including 89 women and 37 children were brought back from Myanmar to Moreh Assam Rifles Camp. This initiative was undertaken jointly by the AR and the Police.

SATURDAY, 19 AUGUST, 2023**Mahabali Kabui Khul, District- Imphal West, Police Station- Porompat Police Station.**

At around 1:30 p.m, a Kabui woman Mrs. Ahat Golmei w/o G. Mr. Athemei Kabui residents of Mahabali Kabui Khul in Imphal was attacked by two Meitei men while resting inside her bedroom in her residence. She suffered injury on her head, eye and other parts of her body according to the report submitted to the OC of Porompat Police Station.

SUNDAY, 20 AUGUST, 2023**T. Laijang Village, Kangchuparea , District-Kangpokpi District, Sub-division- Saitu Gamphazol.**

Mr. Letkhohen Haokip of T. Laijang, a Kuki-Zo village in Kangchup area passed away while on duty defending his village.
